The University has 11 undergraduate departments and 9 graduate schools. Currently, 629 faculty members and 22,000 students (undergraduate 20,000, graduate 2,000) are on campus, challenging the future with a dauntless spirit. Since 1996 the new student-oriented academic system opened broader research opportunities including dual-majors, double-majors, dual pedagogic courses, major-transfer, early-graduation, domestic university credit exchange scheme, overseas student exchange program, and transfer, etc.</p> <p>The newly furnished dormitory allows a safe and convenient environment for students to pursue their studies, accommodating 1000 persons.</p> <p>The university has 3 campuses; Seung-hak which has 7 colleges including humanities and engineering as well as the administrative headquarters, Gudeok Campus which has the medical and arts colleges, and Bumin Campus which has the law school and life-long learning center. CREDIT SYSTEM

1. Introduction

- Each semester will be 15 weeks; each academic year at least 30 weeks.
- 1 credit point will be the equivalent of 15 hours of class per semester. Experiments and Practical Training will be granted 1 credit point for 30 hours per semester.

5. Eligibility for examinees: If the attendance is below 1/3 of total classes, students will not be eligible to take tests.

6. Academic warning: GPA below 1.5 or 9 credits or more of grade F

Students who received an academic warning twice will have limited course registration for the following semester. Three academic warnings will remove the student from the register.

7. GPA formula: $(\text{GPA for each course} \times \text{number of credits}) / \text{Total number of registered credits}$
