Application Guidelines

[September 2015 Admission]

In order to nurture specialized researchers with sophisticated research skills among those candidates with a strong desire to proceed to the Doctoral Program, the Graduate School of Political Science expedites the admissions process by offering Special Admission to graduates of the Master's Program/Professional Degree Program of GSPS.

1. Admissions Quota: Strictly limited

2. Application Requirements:

Candidates must meet the requirements stated in both (1) and (2), listed below.

- Be a current student in the Master's Program or the Professional Degree Program of the Graduate School of Political Science and be on schedule to complete in September 2015.
- 2) Have passed the Analytical Methods Certification Examination.

3. Application period:

June 15 ~ June 17, 2015

4. Application Procedures:

Submit the application to the GSPS Office in person during the application period (9:00~17:00, Monday to Friday), or post* by delivery-certified mail (kan-i kakitome yuubin).

5. Application Documents

- **1** Application Forms [Prescribed Forms]
- 2 Research Plan [Prescribed Form]

You must complete the whole description of the research plan within 5 pages of Japanese or 10 pages of English.

3 English Examination Score Card:

- Submit a score card from TOEFL, TOEIC or IELTS. (The examination must have been taken within the previous 2 years.)
- A photocopy is acceptable. Applicants can submit scores of more than one of the examinations mentioned above.
- Native speakers of English are not required to submit a score card.

^{*}Applications registered at the Post Office on June 17 will be accepted.

- XYou may be deemed to have committed a dishonest act if you have falsified, fabricated, or plagiarized a document, material or information submitted in your application. In such cases, any decision taken with regard to your application may later be invalidated, and the application documents submitted will not be returned.
- XYou do not have to submit a copy of either your Master's Thesis or your Master's Thesis Outline.

1 0. **Entrance Procedures:** July 30 ~ August 6, 2015

**As a rule, we do not return submitted documents or refund school expenses and fees (the entrance fee and school expenses for the first semester). However, if you do not enter Waseda University due to unavoidable circumstances or fail to meet the entrance qualifications prior to enrollment, we may refund the school expenses for the first semester alone (though not the entrance fee). For more information about the procedure for receiving such refunds, refer to the handbook on entrance procedures mailed to successful applicants.

No examination fee is required for the Special Admission application.

[Notes]

- 1. The entrance fee (admission fee) is not required if those who enrolled, graduated, or withdrew from an undergraduate school or graduate school of Waseda University enter the university again.
- 2. Graduates of the Graduate School of Political Science, Graduate School of Economics or School of Political Science and Economics will be exempt from paying the society enrollment fee.
- 3. Other fees are subject to change without notice.

Once submitted or paid, application materials and the registration fee (admission fee) and academic fees (for 2015 Fall Semester) paid at the time of admission shall not, as a rule, be refunded. However, if a student has to decline admission owing to unavoidable circumstances, academic fees and other fees (for 2015 Fall Semester) except the registration fee (academic fees) may be refunded. If an applicant receives offers of admission from more than one graduate school, any admission fee, academic fees, and other fees (for 2015 Fall Semester) already paid at the time of admission by the student may, at the student's request, be applied to the fee for the graduate school that the student seeks to enter. (This applies only to transfers of fees between graduate schools whose enrolment periods do not overlap at all.) For details of the procedure for this, see the "Guide to Entrance Procedures" sent to successful applicants.

13. Note

Waseda University utilizes applicant information (addresses, names, dates of birth, etc.) collected at the time of application in order to carry out operations such as the entrance examination, announcement of the screening results, and enrollment procedures. We will take necessary and proper measures to protect such information from leakage, disclosure or unauthorized use. All or part of the above operations may be outsourced to an agency. In such cases, the agency will be contractually required to maintain necessary and proper management. Please note that the personal information may be used as materials for studies and research to improve our entrance examinations. The information will be statistically processed to prevent any individuals from being identified.

If you expect to require special care during the entrance examination or after entering the university due to a disability or serious medical condition, etc., please contact the Graduate School of Political Science Office at Waseda University immediately. In addition, contact us if a serious injury or illness is expected to affect your ability to take the entrance examination. Please contact us immediately even if you find yourself in such a situation after submitting your application.

Waseda University has provided the following guidelines so that all examinations can be properly administered and all examinees have an opportunity to perform in a fair and equitable environment. Please read the guidelines carefully and approach the examination in a serious manner.

- 1. You may be deemed to have committed a dishonest act if Waseda University determines that you have falsified, fabricated or plagiarized the document(s), statement(s) or information submitted for your application.
- 2. Your actions may be considered dishonest if you commit any of the following acts:
- ① Cheating (concealing or glancing at a cheat sheet or reference book during the examination, glancing at another examinee's answer sheet, or gaining answers from others)
- ② Providing benefits to other examinees (providing them with answers, etc.) during the examination
- 3 Keeping your mobile phone with you or using it during the examination
- Letting your mobile phone or watch emit noise (incoming call alert, alarm, vibration, etc.) during the
 examination
- © Conducting acts that could be considered a nuisance to other examinees at the examination venue
- © Not following instructions from the examination supervisors at the examination venue
- ② Pretending to be an applicant and taking the examination for the actual applicant
- ® Conducting other acts impairing the fairness of the examination
- 3. The following responses may be taken if an applicant is suspected of committing a dishonest act:
 - A supervisor may warn or question the applicant.
 - The applicant may be requested to take the examination in another room.
- 4. In addition, the following responses may be taken if a dishonest act is identified:
 - The applicant may not be allowed to continue taking the examination or allowed to take any other entrance examination given by Waseda University during that year. (Screening fees will not be returned.)

The results of all entrance examinations taken by the applicant at Waseda University during that year

may become invalid.

< Unforeseen problems that are beyond human control>

In cases of unforeseen circumstances that are beyond human control, such as natural disasters (e.g., typhoons,

earthquakes, flooding, tsunami) and/or accident, such as fire, power failure, and so on, measures including

delaying the start of the exam or postponing the exam, etc., may be taken. However, in such an event, we will

bear no responsibility for any resulting inconvenience, expense, or other personal loss that the examinee may

incur.

<Requests to Applicants>

1. Protect yourself against illness by taking measures such as hand washing and gargling in order to be able to

take the entrance examination in top physical condition.

2. Please wear a mask at the examination venue as needed to protect yourself from contagious diseases such as

influenza. If you are coughing or sneezing, please try to prevent the transmission of illness by wearing a

mask or covering your mouth.

If you have been accepted by one Waseda undergraduate school and completed the payment of entrance fee,

school expenses and other fees to that school and are later accepted by another Waseda undergraduate school

that you prefer to enter, you can enter the preferred undergraduate school and request to have the amount you

have already paid transferred to that school. However, this procedure can be done only when the enrollment

procedure periods of the two schools do not overlap. For more information about the procedure, please refer to
