Visa	Exchange students are required to have an official visa (student) for entry into Korea.
Facilities	Upon arrival, each incoming exchange student will receive a student ID card. With this ID, the student can use the facilities on campus, such as the library, etc.
Orientation	The orientation for exchange students will be held 24, 25 of August. Therefore, exchange students must arrive in Korea until last week in August.

FAQs

Q1. Do you accept students of any nationalities? If not, who are not eligible?

A1. We accept students of ANY nationalities, if there is no problem with achieving D-2 student visa.

Q2. Do you accept non-GSAPS students?

A2. Yes, but we only accept students on the basis of Waseda GSAPS's discretion.

Q3. Will exchange students allowed and able to take courses offered by other schools at the University?

A3. Yes, if an instructor at KU gives a concerned student permission to take his/her course.

Q4. Are there any academic requirements for MA exchange students while at the University?

A4. Min 6 and Max 12 credits per semester are required for the postgraduate students.

Q5. Are there any academic requirements for Ph.D. students while at the University?

A5. It is possible for PhD exchange student to research without taking courses in KU. KU does not randomly or forcefully match students and professors up. If PhD exchange students wants to have a specific professor as supervisor, students have to contact the professor individually and ask for his/her agreement to become supervisor. Meanwhile, Ph.D.students can take courses up to 4.

Q6. Are there any additional application documents to be submitted if the applicant is Ph.D. student?

A6. No you don't have to submit any additional document.

Q7. Will exchange students be able to take local language classes free of charge at the university?

A7. Free Korean language classes (4 weeks) are offered to students who completed a regular semester at KU during winter/summer break.

Also, we have Korean language classes as Elective General Studies subject during regular semester. From beginner to advanced, the exchange students can apply for various regular elective courses and they are 3 credit classes.

(Beginner's Korean, Intermediate Korean, Advanced Korean, Advanced Media Korean, Korean Speaking for Beginners, Intermediate Korean Speaking, Intermediate Korean Reading, Advanced Korean Reading, Korean Writing for Beginners, Intermediate Korean Writing, Advanced Korean Writing, etc)

Q8. Do you accept a TOEIC score as a certificate of English language proficiency?

A8. No, TOEIC score is not accepted, but TOEFL and IELTS scores are accepted.

Q9. Will students with an academic degree from at an institution in an English speaking country be exempted from submitting a certificate of English language proficiency?

A9. No, ONLY native speakers of English will be exempted from submitting a certificate of English language proficiency.
