## Q13. Any comments and other useful information (e.g., visa, orientation, local information)

After students enrollment have been confirmed from program coordinator, the acceptance letters are sent to students for applying VISA. They will receive Non-Immigrant VISA category Education allowing to stay in Thailand for 3 months, the extended letters are sent to them by the faculty/program coordinator before the expiration date. Besides the acceptance letters, housing guidebook and orientation schedule are also sent to students. However, there is no housing on Tha Prachan campus, so, International Affairs Office arranges Housing tour for foreign students.

It is the pre-arrival info that students can download before departure. The Exchnaged student's orientation will be provided a week prior to the first day of semester. The session will provide all issues they need to know to stay at Thammasat University comfortably.
