**Title: International Careers in Academia**



(概要)

WIAS asked me to introduce myself and to provide some information about my academic career. My training and my professional career have poor relationship with the French universities. I assume you may have any notion of the very bizarre French higher education system. In a few words, let's say that, in my country, we have universities, like everywhere abroad, with training programs in Law and Economics, Medicine and Biology, Physics and Chemistry, Humanities and Social Sciences, and so

on. But engineers and managers attend special schools, State funded and private as well. There is also a series of very selective schools, three for humanities and social sciences. They offer a small number of fellowships (around 80 each academic year, in a 65 million people country!). I have been fortunate enough to get one of these fellowships first. Later, when I began to prepare my Ph.D degree on Spanish and Portuguese history, I received another fellowship at the French Research Institute in Madrid. I was appointed at EHESS as teaching assistant, and later associate and full Professor in the same institution. The EHESS is a trans-disciplinary university in humanities and social sciences, which provides exclusively Masters and Ph.D degrees. Many of its scholars are used to teach part time in foreign universities. I had the opportunity to accept visiting professorships in the US, the UK, Argentina, and also in Japan, at Meiji University, five years ago. At the beginning of my research career, I wrote papers and books about the shaping of the so-called (early)-Modern State. Later I developed projects in comparative history (Spain and absolutist France, Spain in North Africa). I also published a book about political and cultural perceptions of African men in 17th century Britain, as a result of my two-year professorship at Oxford. The last month, I came out a new book about the relationship between Spanish soldiers and Portuguese women in the Azores islands in the 17th century. Currently, I am preparing a very short book, which is a plea for a political history of racial categories. Afterwards, I will publish a larger book on the same topic co-authored by my colleague Silvia Sebastiani.
