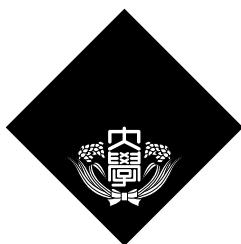

●Tuition Assistance

Waseda University Partial Tuition-Waiver Scholarship for Privately Financed International Students

Eligibility	●Undergraduate/Graduate students (Excluding doctoral program students)
Stipend	50% reduction from one-year tuition
Number to be awarded in 2010	about 440
Scholarship Period	1 year
Purpose of Scholarship	This scholarship is designated for privately financed students with distinguished academic records. Based on academic records, students are awarded a 50% reduction in their yearly tuition.

●Privately Funded International Students Scholarship Scheme

Eligibility	●Newly Admitted Undergraduate / Graduate students
Stipend	¥200,000/year
Number awarded in 2010	142
Scholarship Period	1 year
Purpose of Scholarship	Regular undergraduate and graduate foreign students who are privately financed are eligible for this scholarship. Recipients are selected based on academic achievement and financial circumstances.

●Azusa Ono Memorial Scholarship

Stipend	¥300,000~360,000/year
Number awarded in 2010	Undergraduate students: 40 Graduate students: 63
Scholarship Period	1 year
Purpose of Scholarship	This scholarship commemorates Azusa Ono, one of the key figures at the time when Waseda University was founded and is designated to support the studies of foreign students with limited financial resources.

●Scholarship for Young Doctoral Students

Eligibility	●Students enrolled after the 2009 academic year ●Regular full-time doctoral student, within the standard years of their degree ●Students under 30 years of age on April 1st of the year of receiving scholarship
Stipend	¥400,000 or 600,000/year
Number of Candidates	All applicants who fulfill qualifications and submit all necessary application documents and are deemed to be scholars of good merit.
Scholarship Period	1 year
Purpose of Scholarship	The purpose of this scholarship is to support and encourage admission of young researchers with high-level research skills and a rich knowledge base in graduate school doctoral courses.

●Waseda University's 125th Anniversary Scholarships

Eligibility	●Undergraduate/Graduate students
Stipend	The stipend amount, application period, and number of candidates differ from school to school.
Purpose of Scholarship	These scholarships were established in commemoration of Waseda University's 125 th Anniversary, in order to provide financial assistance to students who fulfill each undergraduate/graduate school's principles and aims of education.

●Emergency Scholarship for International Students

Eligibility	●Undergraduate/Graduate students ●Students who have experienced a sudden change in family finances within the last 1 year
Stipend	¥400,000/year
Number of Candidates	19 maximum
Scholarship Period	1 year
Purpose of Scholarship	This scholarship is designated for students, who at the time of application, have had a sudden change in their family's financial circumstances within the past year and are seen as experiencing difficulties in their academic endeavors.

Fig. 1 Annual Changes in Number of International Students in Japan (As of each May 1)

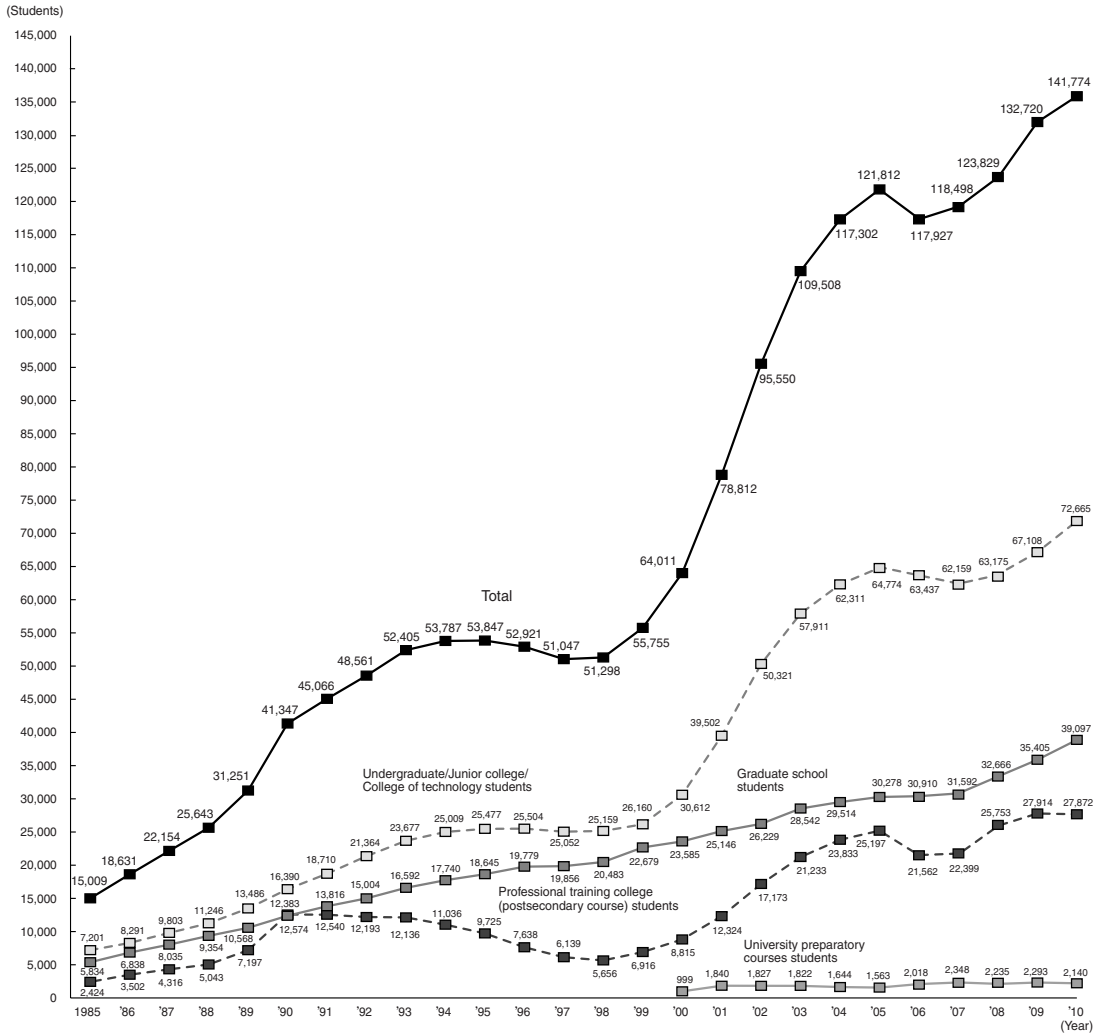


Fig. 2 International Students in Japan by Region of Origin (As of May 1, 2010)
