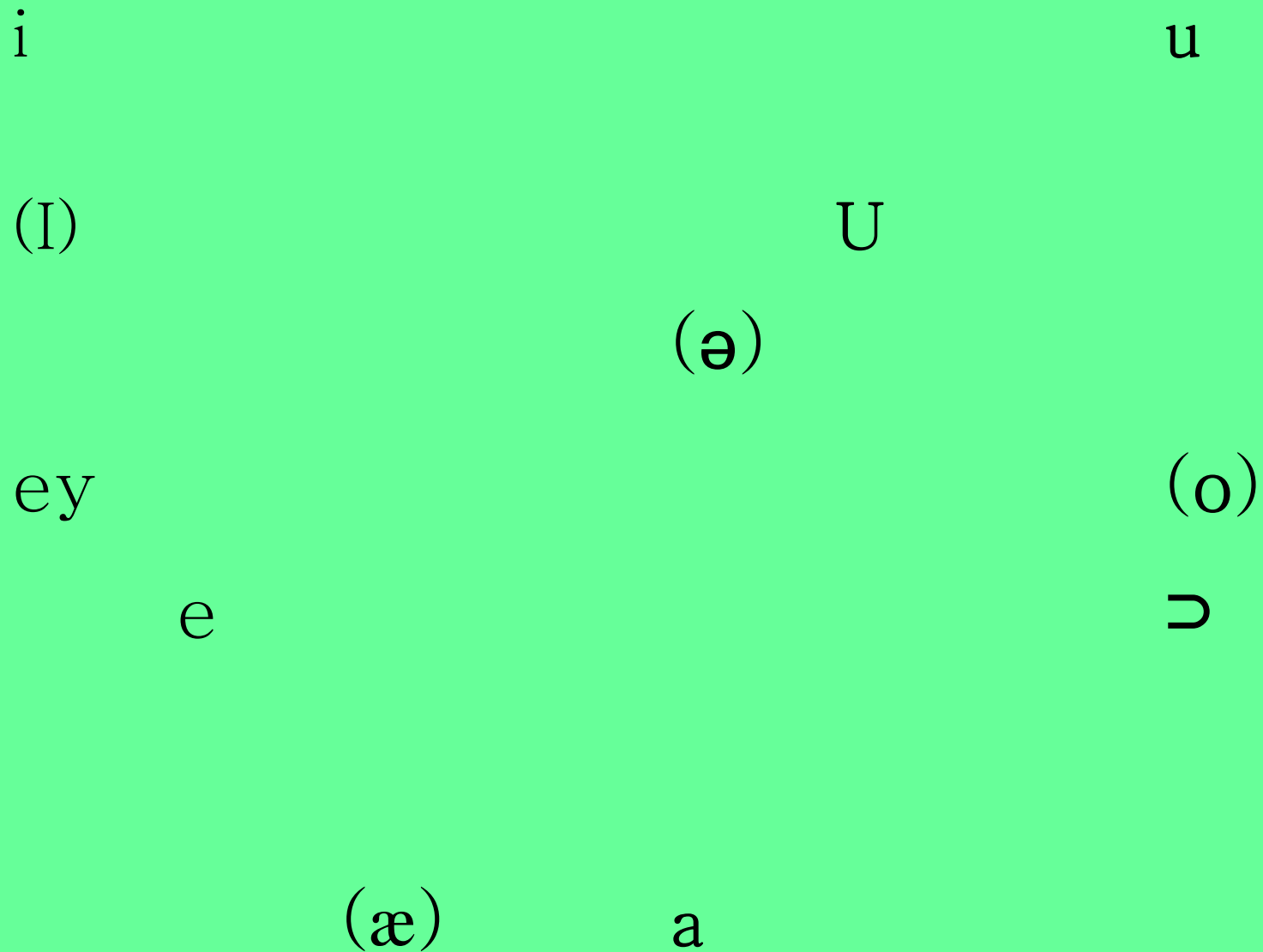

# Suprasegmentals of Philippine English

(Tayao, forthcoming)

- Final rising intonation for both *yes-no* and *wh*-questions
- Juncture: Syllable-timed rhythm
- Word stress: Different from General American English  
e.g. *govérn, circúmstance, adólescent*
- Pause break in the wrong position  
e.g. *...the people who were accustomed to see him begging began to ask...*
