講義概要

This course is intended primarily to familiarize graduate students with some of the organizational and rhetorical skills they will need to prepare scholarly papers for publication in English. Important technical aspects of scholarly writing such as formatting and citation will be covered, as will the use of such research tools as citation and concordancing software. In addition, students will be asked to produce an English version of a research proposal related to their field of academic interest. For those interested in presenting their findings orally in an international academic setting, this course is complementary to (and may be taken in conjunction with) the Academic Presentation Skills course offered in the second semester.
