Language Requirement	■ Choose one: from TOEFL (iBT 80 or above/ ITP 550 or above), IELTS (6.0 or above), English CEFR (B2 or above), CET (4 or above), TOPIK (3 or above) or Duolingo English Test (110 or above). * A proof of English proficiency certified by home university other than the above transcript is NOT accepted. * Not required for students who meet at least one of the followings: 1) Native speakers 2) Students other than Business Administration majors 3) Applicants with undergraduate/graduate degrees from institutions in which English is the primary language of instruction (Students have to submit an official letter from the home university confirming the above statement.)

### ⑥ Expected Arrival Date

\* Dormitories and room types are **randomly allocated and cannot be changed.**

\* Before applying, please check the campuses where the courses will be held.

\* Overseas transfer takes few days and late remittance can occur automatic cancellation of application.

\* Dormitory application information will be provided to accepted students via email.

## ⑬ Visa and ARC (Alien Registration Card)

- The student visa comes in two types: D-2-6 for exchange students and D-2-8 for visiting students.
- Students should secure a D-2 visa from their home country, and are responsible for any issues upon entry with a tourist visa (K-ETA).
- You can apply for an Alien Registration Card (ARC) individually or as a group.
  - \*Group applications are managed by our school's chosen agency, Hire Diversity, and may incur associated costs
- The ARC issuance time, typically around 45 days, remains uncertain regardless of whether you apply individually or as a group.
- Leaving Korea without obtaining an ARC after entering with a D-2 student visa will automatically expire your visa.
- Making travels to other countries is only possible after obtaining the ARC, so please plan your trips after your midterm exams.
- Visa extensions for personal reasons after the semester ends must be handled individually, as the university can not provide guidance.

## ⑭ National Health Insurance System (NHIS)

- Students with a D-2 Visa is subject to the mandatory subscription to the National health insurance of Korea.
- Monthly fee of about USD 60 is automatically subscribed (No action required from students.)
- If student don't pay the fee, visa extension after the semester may be restricted.
- Since NHIS does not cover all injury costs, it is recommended to obtain **personal full-coverage insurance during stay in Korea.**

Description	The SKKU International Summer Semester (ISS) is an annual 4-week summer program. Details about this year's program are available at the official website; every year, the program selects a theme that is most intriguing and relevant to their courses, ensuring that each one is cohesively related to it. A number of renowned professors around the world are going to share their knowledge and insight with highly motivated international students at Seoul campus of SKKU. <b>Exchange students are eligible for a 100% tuition scholarship, which means they are exempted from paying tuition fees. (Should be noted that cultural activities fees may still apply)</b>

### Ⓑ SKKU WISE (Winter International Student Experience)

Description	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ Academic Courses: WISE courses have the same academic standards as those offered during the fall and spring semesters, and depending on the host university's policies, they may be used for transfer credits. Courses are offered in English or Korean.</li> <li>■ Explore Korea: Unique two-week program that takes place at the end of January. It is focused on intensive Korean language studies and K-Culture (media, entertainment, music, dance, fashion), which has swept the globe in recent years. This program is an excellent opportunity for international students to learn about what drives K-Culture's international popularity all while experiencing the beauty of winter in Korea.</li> <li>■ Intensive Korean Language Course: This is an online course offered every January for for students who are beginners to learn Korean effectively in a short period of time.</li> </ul>
