#### **Health Insurance and U-Pass**

Effective April 2018, exchange students **WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE** for public health insurance coverage through the Province of Manitoba. All students must purchase travel medical insurance for the duration of their studies at the University of Manitoba. This may be purchased through your home institution, a private insurer in your home country, or through the <u>University of Manitoba Student Union</u>.

Exchange students may choose to opt in to purchase a <u>U-Pass</u>, a bus pass that provides unlimited access to Winnipeg Transit bus services for a full semester. The Fall pass is valid from September 1 – December 31, and the Winter pass is valid from January 1 – April 30. The cost is \$134.10 per term and exchange students can buy the U-Pass by bringing a copy of their fee statement and registration (available on Aurora) to the Answers Info Booth in University Centre during the opt in period. ### **Visa Information**

Some students, depending on the length of study in Canada and their country of citizenship, will require a visa and study permit. Please contact your closest Canadian consulate for information about your specific visa requirements.

Effective March 15, 2016, all citizens from visa-exempt countries are required to have an Electronic Travel Authorization BEFORE arriving in Canada. ### Off-campus housing

Renting an apartment on your own can be a difficult option for exchange students, particularly if you plan to stay in Winnipeg for less than one year. Because standard rental practice requires you to sign a one-year lease when renting an apartment, when you leave prior to the expiration of your lease, you are still responsible for making monthly rental payments.

Course load:	3-4 courses per term are suggested. Students may take 5, but this is considered a heavy course load, especially for students whose first language is not English.	
Course choices:  Examinations	whose first language is not English.  Exchange students can select most courses offered at Asper during their exchange semester, as long as the student meets pre requisite requirements and there is space available in the course.  Some courses may require professor approval for enrolment.  Students may take courses outside of the Asper School of Business, such as in Economics, Psychology or History, but approval is subject to these departments.
