Course selection	✓ Provisional course list sent with application documents. ✓ Confirmation upon arrival during the orientation days. Course selection is binding and cannot be modified after the first 2 weeks of the semester.
Course load per semester	✓ Courses are validated with grades and ECTS credits. ✓ Courses generally offer 30-36 hours of lecture and require 54 or 108 hours of autonomous course work per semester. ✓ On average 7 to 8 courses per week (around 20 hours per week) are necessary to validate 30 ECTS in one semester. ✓ The course selection depends on the requirements of each home institution. ✓ Work-study (alternance) is a possible option for degree-seeking students ONLY. ✓ It is not possible to choose courses across different programs.

The International Affairs Office organizes a student orientation the first week of students' arrival. This includes getting students acclimated to the French business school structure, French language courses, and the French culture. In the first month of the students' arrival, the International Affairs Office takes exchange students on an excursion in the Paris area to a cultural area. Past events have included, a competitive cultural treasure hunt at the Chateau de Versailles and an outing to the theatre in the center of Paris.

The Student Life office has a student organization called Open Up, which facilitates the connection between exchange students and full-time students at EDC and ensures an exciting and successful semester! Open Up is a part of the Erasmus Student Network and helps integrate exchange students to the school and to the Paris area.
