Summer School 2019 (SS2019)

1. Outline

Patterns of regional integration in East Asia, including in Southeast Asia, have long been shaped by strong concerns over sovereignty, state authority, and non-interference; these have often been used to contrast the region with, for example, Western Europe. But populist and nationalist pressures have recently begun to inform debates in the West as well, raising questions about how global pressures driving these trends are likely to affect continuing institutional development in East Asia. How can we theorize populism and its consequences in East Asia? How will East Asia respond to recent turbulence (such as the China-US trade war in 2018) in that is often driven by populist and nationalist concerns from outside of the region? And how will these trends affect the social, cultural, economic, and political debates of countries in the region?

- ◆ **Theme:** East Asian Regional Integration in a Populist and Nationalist Age: Rhetoric, Emotion, and Action
- ◆ **Period:** July 29 (Mon.) - August 2 (Fri.) 2019
* Attendance in the Preliminary Seminar held on July 6th (Sat.) is mandatory.
- ◆ **Venue:** Waseda University (Tokyo)
- ◆ **Instructor:** Professor LEHENY, David
- ◆ **Credit:** Three (3) credits will be given under the course title “Theories of Asian Regional Integration (EAUI)” which counts as a GSAPS official course toward graduation.

- ◆ **Eligibility:** Graduate students enrolled in a regular degree program of Waseda University
- ◆ **Number of Openings:** 10 (maximum)
- ◆ **Schedule (tentative)**

July 5 (Fri.)	Due date for submission of the first essay. The deadline is 17:00. No late submissions will be accepted.
July 6 (Sat.)	Preliminary Seminar (attendance is mandatory) Due date for submission of the first essay. The deadline is 17:00. No late submissions will be accepted.
July 29 (Mon.)	Opening remarks and lectures (Periods 1-4); Welcome dinner (evening)
July 30 (Tue.)	Lectures and Group Work (Periods 1-4)
July 31 (Wed.)	Field Trip (destination: Miraikan); Group Work
Aug. 1 (Thu.)	International Symposium; Group Work
Aug. 2 (Fri.)	Presentations and discussion (Periods 1-4); Farewell party (evening)
Aug. 9 (Fri.)	Due date for submission of the second essay. The deadline is 20:00. No late submissions will be accepted.

2. Course Requirements

30%	Attendance in full at both the preliminary seminar and the summer school at Waseda University.
30%	Essay 1: A roughly 800-word (日本語約 2,000 字) reaction paper based on the readings provided by any one of the five lecturers. This reaction paper is to summarize the main arguments of the readings (very important) and to raise critical questions about these arguments.
20%	Essay 2: A roughly 500-word report (日本語約 1,500 字) based on the lectures the professors give during the course. Preferably, this paper addresses the questions you raised in your first paper and explains how the professors have dealt with these issues.
10%	Presentation 1 (during the preliminary seminar at WU)
10%	Presentation 2 (during the Summer School 2019 session)

3. Application Procedure

3-1. Download the Application Form

3-2. Submit the Application Documents

Prepare and bring all the required documents outlined below to the GSAPS Office before the application deadline: **17:00 May 6 (Mon.), 2019** (We will not accept any applications after the deadline).

【Required Documents】

- ◇ Application Form for the Summer School 2019
*The Form requires your Project Adviser's permission and signature. Please consult your Project Adviser well ahead of the deadline.
- ◇ Essay: State your objectives for participating in the program, within 400 words in English. If possible, elaborate on how the program's theme relates to your own research project or academic interest. The free-form essay must be typed, not hand-written.
- ◇ A photocopy of the latest English proficiency test score card (TOEFL/IELTS/TOEIC)
*The expected test score is as follows: TOEFL iBT 80/PBT 550/ IELTS6.0/TOEIC750.
While you may apply with a lower test score, please note that English proficiency is one of the important criteria for selection.
*Native speakers of English are not required to submit the certificate.
*If you do not have the score card now, but instead submitted it upon your enrollment at Waseda, please inform the office.

4. Screening and Notification of Screening Result

Application documents will be reviewed by the committee. An interview may be required for some applicants. Successful applicants will be selected based on factors including academic performance (GPA etc.), your application essay, and English proficiency. All applicants will receive the screening result after May 14 (Tue.) e-mailed to their Waseda-net address. The GSAPS Office will not address any inquiries regarding the screening process or individual screening results.

5. After the Notification of Screening Result

All successful students will be asked to submit the following to the GSAPS Office by May 20 (Monday).
- a signed consent form

6. Course Registration

The course registration will be handled automatically for successful applicants.

7. Additional Remarks

- 7-1. All participants are required to attend the whole program, including the receptions. Attendance in the Preliminary Seminar (July 6) is also mandatory.
- 7-2. Summer School 2019 may be cancelled in the event of unforeseen emergency (e.g., natural disaster or civil disturbance). Please make sure that your academic plan will not be severely undermined even under such circumstances.
- 7-3. Any participant who withdraws from the program after the completion of the registration procedure will receive an “F” for the course.
- 7-4. Your application will be taken to mean that you have understood these rules. Successful applicants will be asked to submit “the consent form for Summer School 2019 participation” with their signature.
