## FAQs

Q1. Do you accept students of any nationalities? If not, who are not eligible?

A1. We accept students of ANY nationalities, if there is no problem with achieving D-2 student visa.

Q2. Will exchange students allowed and able to take courses offered by other schools at the University?

A2. Yes, if an instructor at KU gives a concerned student permission to take his/her course.

Q3. Are there any academic requirements for MA exchange students while at the University?

A3. Min 6 and Max 12 credits per semester are required for the postgraduate students.

Q4. Are there any academic requirements for Ph.D. students while at the University?

A4. It is possible for PhD exchange students to conduct their research without taking courses at KU.

KU does not randomly or compulsorily match students and professors up. If a PhD exchange student wants to have a specific professor as supervisor, that student will have to contact the professor individually and ask for his/her agreement to become supervisor. Meanwhile, Ph.D. students can take courses up to 4 per semester.

Q5. Are there any additional application documents to be submitted if the applicant is a Ph.D. student?

A5. No you don't have to submit any additional document.

Q6. Will exchange students be able to take local language classes free of charge at the university?

A6. Free Korean language classes (4 weeks) are offered during winter/summer break to the students who completed a regular semester at KU.

Also, we have Korean language classes as Elective General Studies subject during regular semester.

From beginner to advanced, exchange students can enroll in various regular elective courses (3 credits): Academic Reading in Korean (KORE138), Academic Writing in Korean (KORE140), Korean Language and Literature (KORE151), Beginner's Korean I (IFLS108), Beginner's Korean II (IFLS109), Intermediate Korean I (IFLS110), Intermediate Korean II (IFLS111), Advanced Korean I (IFLS112), Advanced Korean II (IFLS113), Korean Speaking for Beginners I (IFLS240), Korean Speaking for Beginners II (IFLS241), Intermediate Korean Speaking (IFLS242), Intermediate Korean Reading (IFLS243), Advanced Korean Reading (IFLS244), Korean Writing for Beginners (IFLS245), Intermediate Korean Writing (IFLS 246), Advanced Korean Writing (IFLS 247), Advanced Korean for Contemporary Issues (IFLS 249), etc.

Q7. Do you accept a TOEIC score as a certificate of English language proficiency?

A7. No, TOEIC score is not accepted; TOEFL and IELTS scores are accepted.

Q8. Will students with an academic degree from at an institution in an English speaking country be exempted from submitting a certificate of English language proficiency?

A8. No, ONLY native speakers of English will be exempted from submitting a certificate of English language proficiency.
