| Student's Pass | <p>Applications for a Student's Pass must be submitted at least 1 month but not more than 2 months before the commencement of the course through ICA's Student's Pass Online Application and Registration (SOLAR) system.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <u>Registering for a Student's Pass</u> Before you submit an application for a Student's Pass through SOLAR, NTU will register you through SOLAR. 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| TEP Application | <p>Issuance Fee, amount required to pay: S\$225. Multiple Journey Visa Fee (if applicable), amount required to pay - S\$30. Total payment: S\$255 (subject to revision)</p> <p>From July 2012 onwards, TEP duration is valid till maximum of 3 months only. However, the International Students Centre will request through MOM for a longer duration for students coming on exchange. The period requested will be in line with the students' intended period of stay.</p> <p>Under the TEP Pass, you are only allowed to take coursework and doing research during the period of stay in the School of Humanities and in the School of Social Sciences. Please note that TEP holders are allowed to take a maximum of 2 courses only.”</p> |
| Medical Examination | <p>Students who will be studying at NTU for 6 months or more will need to undergo a medical examination before they can be issued the TEP by the Singapore government authority. For approved Training Employment Pass (TEP) application, an In-Principle Approval (IPA) letter will be sent to the School. A medical examination form will be included in the IPA letter if the student is required to go for medical examination.</p> <p>The medical examination includes the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) and chest X-ray, as required by Singapore government authority.</p> <p>The medical examination must be done at the University Health Service Building.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>University Health Service Building 36 Nanyang Avenue Singapore 639801</i></p> <p>Total payment: approximately \$55</p> |
| Facilities | <p>Upon arrival, each incoming exchange student will be issued a student matriculation card. With this card, the student can use the facilities on campus such as the library, gymnasium, swimming pool, etc.</p> |
| Orientation | <p>Exchange students are advised to arrive in Singapore at least 1 week before the start of the teaching week, for example by 5 August 2024, to cater some time for adapting to the environment etc.</p> |

FAQs

Q1. Do you accept students of any nationalities? If not, who are not eligible?

A1. Singaporeans are not allowed to apply.

Q2. Will exchange students be allowed and able to take courses offered by other schools at the University?

A2. Yes. However, other schools may have policies on accepting exchange students. Hence, the approval of course registration is subject to the approval and availability of the selected schools.

Q3. Are there any academic requirements for MA exchange students while at the University? (e.g. Exchange students are required to take X number of courses and can take up to X number of courses.)

A3. Students can choose to do coursework only. Students doing coursework will need to do at least one course but they will need to submit 10 courses for approval. The maximum courses that exchange students can take is five. Students who have received Bachelor's degree are not allowed to take undergraduate courses.

Q4. Are there any academic requirements for Ph.D. exchange students while at the University?

A4. Students can choose to do coursework only. Students doing coursework will need to do at least one course but they will need to submit 10 courses for approval. The maximum courses that exchange students can take is five. Students who have received Bachelor's degree are not allowed to take undergraduate courses

Q5. Are there any additional application documents to be submitted if the applicant is Ph.D. student?

A5. No additional documents are required.

Q6. Will exchange students be able to take local language classes free of charge at the University?

A6. Yes; however the classes are offered to a limited number of students only.

Q7. Tell us the required language proficiency. Do you accept a TOEIC score as a certificate of English language proficiency?

A7. Exchange students do not need English proficiency scores. Home university is expected to access and shortlist students based on their capability to cope with English as the medium of instruction.

Q8. Will students with an academic degree from an institution in an English speaking country be exempted from submitting a certificate of English language proficiency?

A8. Please refer to A7 above.

Q9. Are there any requirements/regulations at the University exchange program applicants should be particularly aware of?

A9. (1) Some courses may have pre-requisites. Students may check the respective websites for the pre-requisites when selecting courses to register or contact the instructor of the course.

(2) Courses selected are not guaranteed for the student. Approval of courses will be conveyed to the students prior to their arrival at NTU.

(3) Language courses offered in are of undergraduate-level. Credits earned cannot be transferred to GSAPS.

Q10. Are there any requirements regarding enrolment period at the University exchange program applicants should be particularly aware of? (Minimum or Maximum study period in Waseda University before participating in exchange program)

A10. No. However, home university is expected to assess applicants if they are suitable to attend exchange programmes in view of cultural differences etc.

Q11. Will exchange students be able to do internship at a company or international organization during the semester exchange program? If so, is there any support to find the institute from the University?

A11. Students are not allowed to do internship while on exchange program.

Q12. Do you have any dormitories where exchange students are allowed to stay?

A12. Yes, there are graduate housing/dormitories for exchange students to apply. However, as applications for these graduate housing/dormitories are highly competitive, applicants are advised to check out the links at the 'Accommodation and Lodging' portion of the fact sheet.

Q13. Please describe the procedure for obtaining the visa and the required documents.

A13. The requirement to apply for visa will depend on the nationality of the applicants. Applicants are advised to check with their respective embassies for the requirement for visa application. Meanwhile, NTU will assist in the application for a student pass (for coursework) or a training employment pass (for research).

Q14. Please send us the list or URL of the courses which exchange students can take.

A14. The list of courses available for the particular semester will only be confirmed at a later date. As such, applicants can email to administrator (jaywan@ntu.edu.sg) from April onwards for the confirmed list of courses.
