Seminar Summary

The 14th Asia Pro Bono Conference (APBC) and Access to Justice Exchange (A2JX) will be held at the Fukuoka International Convention Center from December 2 to 7 of 2026 for the first time in Japan. It is the largest international conference on legal professionals' pro bono activities in Asia and have been hosted annually in cities across Asia.

The seminar will be held in an interactive style to discuss access to justice and pro bono activities from the perspective of human security, and explore the development of pro bono work in Japan, with a particular focus on youth participation.
