Our campuses provide a stimulating academic environment, offering our students a wide range of activities (sports, exhibitions, cultural events, student clubs and circles, etc.).

The university's outwardlooking position with regards to Europe and the world has resulted in a number of agreements, collaborations and special partnerships being set up with some of the world's top universities.

Although ULB is a French-speaking university delivering most of its courses in French, a growing number of Master's degrees are partially or entirely delivered in English as well.

ULB encompasses 12 faculties and schools offering a wide range of fields of study and disciplines.

### Credits and Grading System

#### ULB uses the European Credits Transfer System (ECTS)

Credits are units that are allocated on the basis of the learning outcomes and student workload in a specific study programme (attending lectures, studying time, completing assignments, etc.).

1 credit = 30 hours  
Students' work is marked on a scale from 0 to 20  
Marks from 10 to 20 = students pass the course  
Marks from 0 to 9.99 = students fail the course  
After completing an exchange stay at the ULB, students can access their transcripts online by logging onto the MonULB platform.

### Welcome and Orientation sessions

Welcome Sessions are organised by the faculties at the beginning of each semester in order to enable new students to get acquainted with the campus environment, courses, activities and student life in Brussels. The Erasmus Student Network (ESN) also organises a number of events and activities for incoming students in the days prior to the beginning of each semester :

Students must choose at least 60% of the courses in the faculty, and more precisely, in the field of study they were nominated in. The remaining 40% can be taken in other study programs offered by the faculty or if necessary, eventually, in other faculties.

## Health insurance

NON-EU students are required to apply for an International Student Health Insurance Plan prior to their arrival in the host country.

The health insurance plan must cover them for the entire duration of their stay. Students hosted at ULB will not be granted a visa if they cannot provide proof of coverage by a suitable health insurance.

## Language of instruction

Courses are mostly taught in French. However, in some faculties the number of Master's degrees partly or entirely delivered in English is growing.

It is the student's responsibility to identify from our course catalog whether the course is given in French or English and to verify whether the faculty offers courses taught in English or not.

## Language requirements

For non-native French speakers, a minimum level of B1 (CEFR Level) is required for courses taught in French. However, a B2 level is strongly recommended. Proof of language proficiency is not requested.

# EXCHANGE-RELATED INFORMATION

## Visa

Non-European citizens studying in a European country must hold a visa for their mobility in Belgium. Once a student has received a ULB acceptance letter, they must contact the Belgian Embassy to request a visa:

## blocked account

In order to obtain a study visa in Belgium, non-EU citizens must provide proof of sufficient financial resources to cover their living, study, health care and repatriation expenses for the entire duration of their study stay (academic year or term).
