**1. Specialty:** 18<sup>th</sup> and/or 19<sup>th</sup> century British novels

**2. Number of Positions Available:** One

**3. Position:** Tenured full-time, professor, associate professor or assistant professor

**4. Chief subjects to be taught:**

The School of Culture, Media and Society and the School of Humanities and Social Sciences

- Give lectures and specialised seminars (*enshu*) related to English Literature, focusing mainly on 18<sup>th</sup> and/or 19<sup>th</sup> century British novels in the School of Humanities and Social Sciences
- Give lectures and specialised seminars (*enshu*) related to the above fields in the School of Culture, Media and Society

The Graduate School of Letters, Arts, and Sciences

- Give lectures and seminars, and undertake thesis supervision for students taking the English Studies Course

NB) Specifics of classes will be determined by the departments concerned after the successful applicant has been appointed.

**5. Salary and benefits:** Determined by the university's regulations

- Salary and Allowances: Determined by the university's regulations
- Commutation Allowance: Determined by the university's regulations
- Retirement Payment: Determined by the university's regulations
- Holidays: Saturdays, Sundays, New Year Holidays, National Holidays, Substitute Holidays (instead of the national holidays on which you work in a year) and University Anniversary (excluding days specified by the university on which classes are held)
- Transferring Holidays: Should unavoidable circumstance occur and there is a need to work on holidays, you may transfer the holidays on weekdays.

- Social Insurance: The employee shall be enrolled in the Employee's Pension Insurance, Health Insurance, Workmen's Compensation Insurance, and Employment Insurance.

- 2) Experience working at university or research institute level
- 3) Completed doctoral degree, or equivalent academic attainment

- 1) A written statement outlining why you have applied for this post and what you want to achieve (approximately 500 words in English/A4 sheet or approximately 1,000 characters in Japanese/A4 sheet)
- 2) One copy of the official university CV form 「早稲田大学文学学術院教員応募履歴書」 including teaching experience and publications (either in English or Japanese)

- 3) Single copies of three representative publications (either offprints or photocopies; a doctoral thesis acceptable)
- 4) Sample proposals for two lectures 「文化構想学部・文学部講義試案（2種類）」: one for a basic content class designed for the School of Culture, Media and Society; and another, with more specific content, for the English Studies Course in the School of Humanities and Social Sciences

**10. Selection Schedule:**

- 1) First Stage (screening of application materials): Applicants will be informed of the results by Friday, 21 June 2019.
- 2) Second Stage (interview): Those who pass the first stage will be invited to interview, which will take place from late June to early July 2019. The candidate will also be required to give a sample lesson.

NB) Candidates will NOT be reimbursed for travel expenses. A skype interview might be possible for overseas applicants.

Those who pass the first stage might be required to submit the names and e-mail addresses of their referees.
