Admissions Process (PhD September entry)

1st Round: Document Screening

1st round results announced on July 11

2nd Round: Individual Interviews on July 13

Final results announced by July 18

Program Concept

Advanced scholarly training in Japanese literary and cultural studies.

Coursework and research on **original sources in Japanese**.

Class discussion and writing assignments **in English**.

Language Requirements: Japanese

JLPT [N1 for PhD] *or* EJU [260+ for PhD] *or*

Evaluation Report from a Japanese-Language Teacher.

Language Requirements: English

TOEFL (iBT) [100+ for PhD] *or* IELTS (academic) /
Computer-delivered IELTS (academic) [Band 7+ for PhD]

Other tests/certificates are not accepted.

PhD Graduation Requirements

Research, write, and successfully defend an original PhD thesis in English.

Publish at least one peer-reviewed article in English in a scholarly journal.

Present at least once at a scholarly conference in English.

MA Graduation Requirements

Earn 32 credits (14 compulsory) over two years of residence.

Research, write, and successfully defend an original MA thesis in English.

FAQ : Eligibility

No age limit.

BA in Japanese Studies NOT required.

FAQ: Research Plan (PhD)

In **6,000 words**, explain what materials you intend to research, what questions you want to ask, how your work fits into the existing scholarship on the matter, etc.

Attach a **1,000-character abstract** of your Research Plan **in Japanese**.

FAQ: Statement of Purpose (MA)

In **1,000 words**, explain what are your fields of academic interest, what scholarly questions you find intriguing, how have your education/training/experiences prepared you to pursue them, why you want to conduct your project specifically at Global-J, etc.

FAQ: Writing Samples (PhD)

One or more research papers.

If in Japanese: **20,000 characters** max. (+ 900-word English abstract)

If in English: **12,000 words** max. (+ 1,500-character Japanese abstract)

FAQ: Writing Samples (MA)

1-2 papers in English.

4,000+ words total.

(If submitting 2 papers, one of them may be in Japanese)

FAQ: Additional Information (MA)

Can include third-language proficiency, work experience, creative projects, etc.
