1-2 papers in English.

4,000+ words total.

(If submitting 2 papers, one of them may be in Japanese)

FAQ: Additional Information (MA)

Can include third-language proficiency, work experience, creative projects, etc.

- Final results announced on <u>July 17, 10am (2025)</u>

Language Requirements (PhD): Japanese

Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) [N1]

or

Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU) [260+]

or

Evaluation Report from a Japanese-Language Teacher.

Language Requirements (PhD): English

TOEFL (iBT) 100 and above

or

IELTS (Academic) / Computer-delivered IELTS (Academic)

Band 7 and above

Other tests/certificates are not accepted.

Example Timeline

- 1st year: Coursework, research for thesis, apply and prepare for peer-reviewed article and international conference
- 2nd year: Publish a peer-reviewed article, present at an international conference, take part in symposium workshop, participate in UCLA-Waseda Research Fellowship Program
- 3rd year: Prepare thesis, Double Degree Program available

PhD Graduation Requirements

Research, write, and successfully defend an original PhD thesis in English or Japanese. If the thesis is written in English, one chapter (or equivalent article-length piece) must be written in Japanese; if thesis is written in Japanese, one chapter (or equivalent article-length piece) must be written in English.

Publish at least one peer-reviewed article in a scholarly journal.

Present at least once in an international conference.

FAQ: Research Plan (PhD)

In <u>6,000 words</u>, explain what materials you intend to research, what questions you want to ask, how your work fits into the existing scholarship on the matter, etc, <u>in English</u>.

Attach a **1,000-character abstract** of your Research Plan **in Japanese**.

FAQ: Writing Samples (PhD)

One or more research papers.

If in Japanese: **20,000 characters** max. (+ ~900-word English abstract)

If in English: <u>12,000 words</u> max. (+ ~1,500-character Japanese abstract)

FAQ: Eligibility

No age limit.

BA in Japanese Studies NOT required.
