(1) Requirements for submitting a master's thesis

- (i) The required number of credits have been earned or are to be earned.
- (ii) A master's thesis plan and a master's thesis topic notification have been submitted.
- (iii) Have received the prescribed research ethics education (Waseda Moodle on-demand lecture" 【文学研究科】研究倫理概論(閱覧用)" or JSPS "eL CoRE" [for graduate students]).

(2) Preparation of master's thesis

(i) Submit one data for each person. The same applies if figures or tables are included.

Data format should be PDF. A maximum file size of 100 MB can be accepted.

Prepare a master's thesis in B5 or A4 size. If figures or tables are included, design it to fit within the same data. (Consult the supervisor about the appearance of your thesis).

(ii) The order of the format should be "1. Cover (master's thesis outline / master's thesis) 2. Body (master's thesis outline) 3. Table of contents (master's thesis) 4. Body (master's thesis)". To create the cover, download and use the template provided on the website as necessary.

The Graduate School does not have a prescribed format for the table of contents (master's thesis) and body (master's thesis outline / master's thesis), but please check with your course in advance to see if your course has such format.

- (iii) The volume of a master's thesis outline should be as specified for your course (An outline written in a language other than Japanese must be accompanied by a Japanese translation).
- (iv) The title of the master's thesis and a master's thesis topic notification should be identical word for word (adding a subtitle is not a problem).
