- Social Desirability Bias (SDB) is operating
- it is "multi-dimensional"
- CASI is "cleaner" than PAPI

- some people think that they would continue doing these activities or would try if they had given a chance to do them. some people think that they would rather not to have anything to do with them. what is your opinion?

- over report with PAPI, both experience and willingness
- R want to appear to be "good" citizen
- this is what we "expect" (or SD answer)
- "democratic norm" bias



## "retreatedness" hypothesis

- sense of uneasiness in using (or unwillingness to use) political means to solve personal or social problems
- "Retreatedness" is one major hurdle of political participation
- · creates "bias" during interviews

- under report with PAPI, both experience and willingness
- this is NOT what we "expect" (or SD answer)
- "retreatedness" bias
- R do not want to show his/her political involvements to a stranger (i.e. interviewer)



- less "contaminated" by "interviewer effects"
- CASI data fit "better" to voting/ participatory models?
