

Prospectus

Individual and group behaviors are affected by expectations concerning both the personal well-being and the behavior of others. What promotes and constrains these expectations are institutions, i.e., the behavioral norms and rules that exist in society. Those institutions, however, if they fail to meet social expectations, become dysfunctional, which in turn lowers the level of expectations. To avoid becoming trapped in such a vicious circle, our research center seeks to reveal and examine a set of conditions under which institutions of a society can fulfill the expectations of its members (an “expectation-realizing society”). Building upon the successful achievements of Waseda’s 21COE-GLOPE (Center for Global Political Economy), we have pursued various efforts to integrate political science and economics to establish a new academic discipline, Political Economy. In this symposium, we would like to present the results of our decade-long research and educational activities.
