Candidates will be evaluated based on the quality of their research and teaching experience. They must have a proven record of high-quality research and publications in experimental economics, and be able to teach microeconomics, game theory, or econometrics at the postgraduate level. Proficiency in Japanese is essential. Experience in laboratory management is desirable. The successful candidate will be expected to conduct research, teach courses at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels, supervise students, and perform services for the FPSE. Application Procedure

On the website, choose "Experimental Economics" in "Application Category". In "References", provide the contact information of two reference persons whom we may contact to request your recommendation letters. Upload the following documents for the

relevant sections of "Application Documents". All documents must be PDF files in English or Japanese.

- 1. Cover Letter with your contact information: Download the application form from website: https://www.waseda.jp/fpse/pse/news/2018/07/20/9078/. And fill out. Upload it at "(1) Application Form/Cover Letter".
- 2. Curriculum Vitae: Upload it at "(2) Curriculum Vitae with a list of academic/professional accomplishments". Free format, or format on the website.
- 3. Statement of Research and Teaching: Upload it at "(3) Additional application material 1". The statement should include the following contents: (3-A) a summary of your three major academic works [about 300 words for each work], (3-B) a statement of current and future research plans [about 500 words], and (3-C) a statement of teaching plans at the undergraduate and graduate levels [about 500 words]. Free format.
- 4. Three major academic works: Upload them at "(3) Additional application material 2," "(3) Additional application material 3," and "(3) Additional application material 4".

The receipt of application will be confirmed by e-mail within 10 days after the deadline. There will be three stages in our recruitment process: 1) shortlisting; 2) an interview with the search committee; and 3) an interview with the dean. The first-stage result is expected to be informed in the late October, 2018, and the second-stage interview is expected to be conducted in the early November, 2018.
