No.	Questions	Answers
1	What should I write in column ① and ② of each table?	Please let us know all the specific topics your student has (you have) covered in the classes through secondary/high school (such as linear algebra, calculus, statistics, etc). If the topics are too detailed and you don't know the number of study hours for each subject, you can group the topics together to some extent so that you can fill in the number of study hours.
2	What should I do if my student (I) didn't take calculus held up as the example?	You don't have to follow the example. We do not have a set of required subjects for the evaluation sheet. We would like to know what areas of each class your student has (you have) covered through the evaluation sheet. Please write the subjects according to your high school curriculum.
3	My school doesn't have an educational system that ranks students. What should I write in column ③ of each table?	Please write in the column "Special Note" that the ranking system doesn't exist at your school.
4	What should I do if I can write down the names of the subjects, but can not write the number of study hours per week for each subject?	Please write the class name (such as Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry) in the top cell of column ①. And in column ②, on the total line, please fill in the number of study hours per week for each class, not for each subject. And in the Special Notes column, please indicate that you filled in the number of study hours for each class, as you do not know the number of study hours per subject.
5	What should I do if I can write down GPA, but can not write my student's/my class rank in the field "Your student's/ your rank based on GPA" as the ranking system doesn't exist at our school?	Please fill in the GPA and write "the ranking system doesn't exist at your school" in parentheses.
6	I have the scores of SAT Subject tests (Mathematics Level 2, Physics, and Chemistry) but I couldn't take the SAT Reasoning test since it got cancelled due to the COVID-19. In this case, do I need to submit an evaluation sheet for the SAT reasoning test?	No, you don't need to submit the evaluation sheet. But we strongly recommend that you submit standardized test / university entrance examinations results we required. If you can not take the SAT reasoning test, you can also try to apply for ACT instead of SAT reasoning test, as we accept the combination ACT and SAT Subject Tests as stated on page 54 in the application guideline.
7	What should I do if I can submit the scores of SAT Reasoning test and SAT Subject test (Mathematics Level 2), but I can't submit the scores of Physics and Chemistry due to the COVID-19?	As for the Physics and Chemistry, please submit the evaluation sheet.
