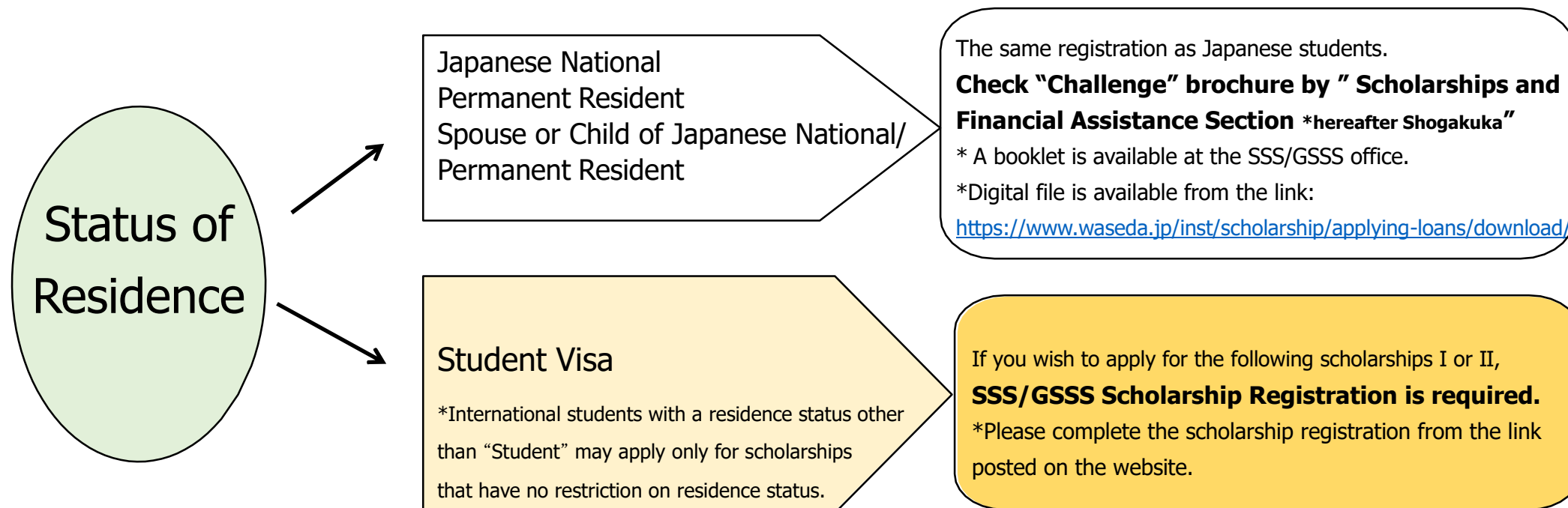


## Scholarship Information for Privately Financed International Students at SSS/GSSS

### I . Scholarship Registration

Registration differs according to your status of residence.



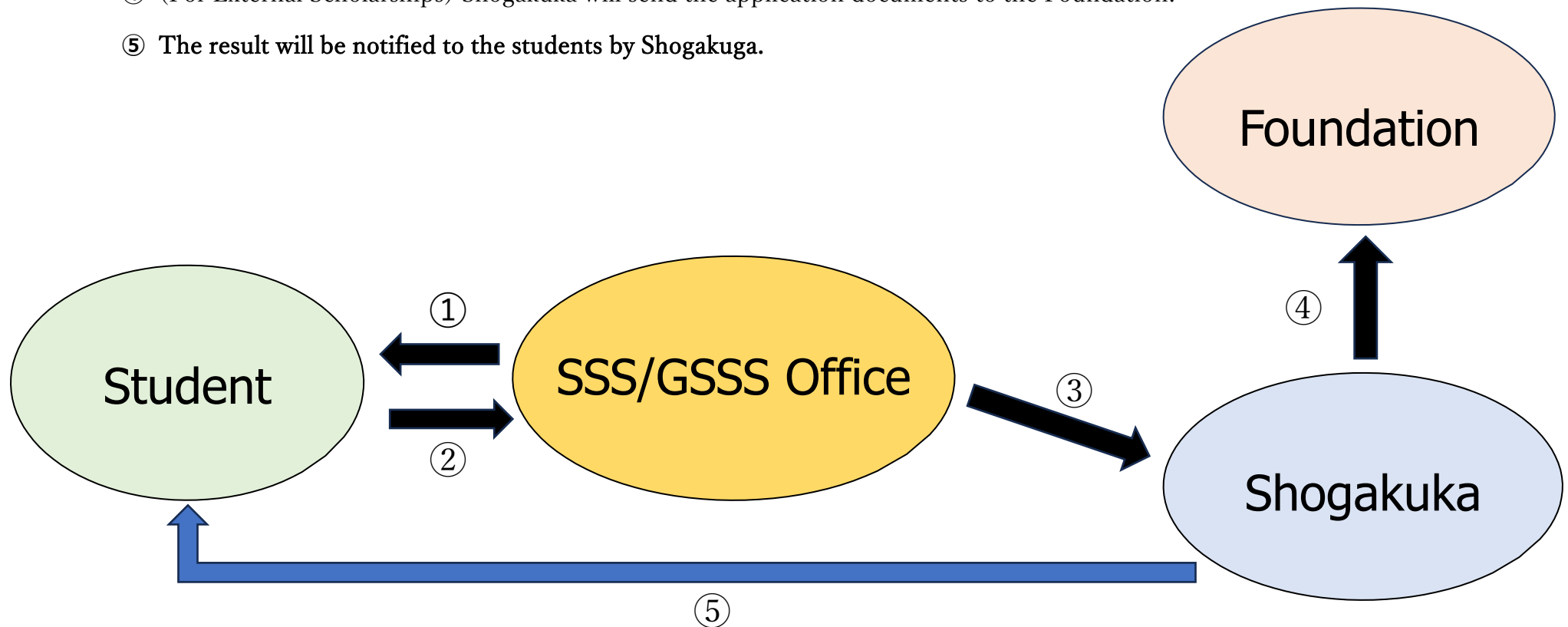
### II . Types of Scholarships for Privately Financed International Students

- I. **Internal Scholarships:** Waseda University's own scholarship. e.g. Tuition-Waiver Scholarship, Azusa Ono Memorial Scholarship  
★Exception: The Okuma Memorial Scholarship does not require any scholarship registration at the SSS/GSSS Office.
- II. **External Scholarships that Require University Recommendation** (Involving Internal Selection)  
★For types of scholarships I and II, selections will be conducted among those who submit the SSS/GSSS Scholarship Registration Form.
- III. **External scholarships / Open Recruitment** (free application):

### III. Scholarship Application Process

#### I and II (Internal Scholarships and External Scholarships that Require University Recommendation)

- ① Candidates will be selected from those who have submitted the SSS/GSSS Scholarship Registration Form.  
Detailed instructions will be sent ONLY to the selected candidates via Waseda mail.
- ② Selected candidates must submit their application documents to the SSS/GSSS Office.
- ③ After reviewing the documents, the SSS/GSSS office will forward them to the Shogakuka.
- ④ (For External Scholarships) Shogakuka will send the application documents to the Foundation.
- ⑤ The result will be notified to the students by Shogakuka.



### III External scholarships / Open Recruitment (free application)

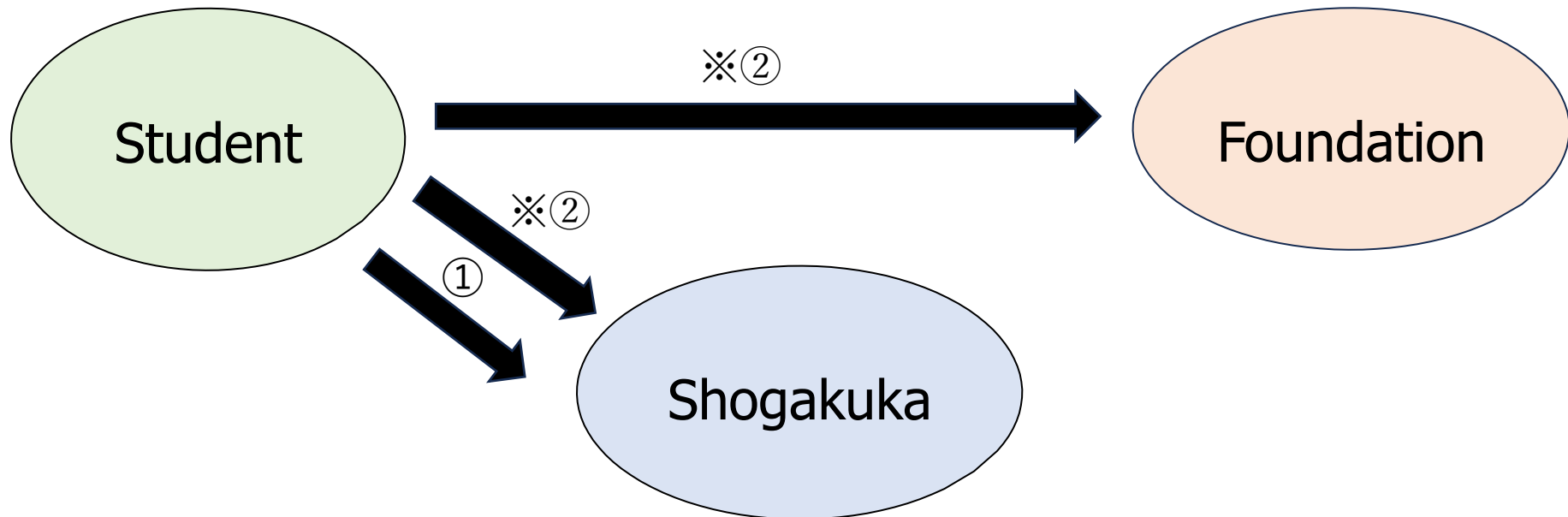

### 〈F A Q〉

・Q1. I have submitted the scholarship registration form, when will I receive the results of the selection process?

・A1. As stated in section III, “Scholarship Application Process,” detailed instructions will be sent ONLY to students who pass the internal selection. If you do not receive any notification about a scholarship (internal or external) approximately one week after the registration deadline, please understand that you were not selected this time.

・Q2. Is it possible to know why I was not selected as a scholarship candidate?

・A2. We are unable to provide any information on the selection process for individual scholarships. Selections are made primarily based on financial need and academic performance.

・Q3. What scholarships can I apply for now?

Please note that scholarships offered by external foundations often require a high level of Japanese proficiency, however, there are some scholarships that can be applied for using English only. Please check the information regularly on your own.

Q5. If the application documents require a letter of recommendation (written by an academic advisor), who should I ask to write it?

A5.

- For first- and second-year students(up to the spring semester) enrolling in April: Request the letter from the faculty member in charge of your Learning Community, or another faculty member you have taken a class with and can ask personally.
- For new students enrolling in September who do not yet have a faculty member to write the recommendation: Consult the SSS/GSSS Office at least three weeks before the submission deadline.
- For second-year students or above who have joined a seminar: Request the letter from your seminar instructor.
- For graduate students: Your academic supervisor will be responsible for writing the letter of recommendation.
