

Delik Hudalah is a professor of metropolitan planning at the School of Architecture, Planning and Policy Development (SAPPD), Institut Teknologi Bandung (ITB), Indonesia, and a senior research fellow at the ITB Research Center for Infrastructure and Regional Development. He is also the Director of the Graduate Program in Urban and Regional Planning and in Transportation at the same faculty. In addition, he serves as an editorial member of the Journal of Regional and City Planning (JRCP) and an editorial board member of the Singapore Journal of Tropical Geography (SJTG).

Micah R. Fisher is a Fellow in the Research Program at the East-West Center. He conducts research on the humandimensions of environmental change such as deforestation, land degradation, and urbanization in the Asia-Pacific. Recent research has focused on deforestation, land rights, and tenure policies in Indonesia and Southeast Asia; Disaster risk, vulnerability, and water insecurity in Greater Jakarta; Agrarian change and livelihoods in Sulawesi; and Technologies of Participation.

She holds a PhD in Architecture from the National University of Singapore and is currently a Postdoctoral Fellow at the Tokyo College, the University of Tokyo.

Riela Drianda is an associate professor at the School of Social Sciences, Waseda University. Her research interests span both pop culture and cultural tourism. Much of her work has been on identifying the growth potential of Asian pop culture for promoting urban culture and heritage assets. She also teaches in the area of urban studies and social design. During her term at Waseda University, she received two prestigious teaching awards from Peking University (2021) and Waseda University (2022).


