

## [TAISI] 60-Credit Limit for Online Courses

As noted in the "TAISI Course Registration Guide 2022" and in the **"(1)Regarding Class Modality Categories"** at the following link, according to the Standards for Establishment of Universities, online courses (courses where online classes account for more than half of the total class hours) may not account for more than 60 credits of the prescribed number of credits (124 credits) required for graduation from undergraduate programs (hereinafter referred to as the "60-credit limit").

All courses offered by the School of Social Sciences for the 2020 and 2021 academic years will not count toward the 60-credit limit for online courses. For courses outside of the School of Social Sciences, please check Web Syllabus and check Class Modality Categories as instructed in (1) above.

For online courses taken in or before 2019, please check Web Syllabus for the previous year and check Class Modality Categories as instructed in (1) above to see if they count toward the 60-credit limit for online courses.

For online courses from this year 2022, please check Web Syllabus and check Class Modality Categories as instructed in (1) above to see if they count toward the 60-credit limit for online courses.
