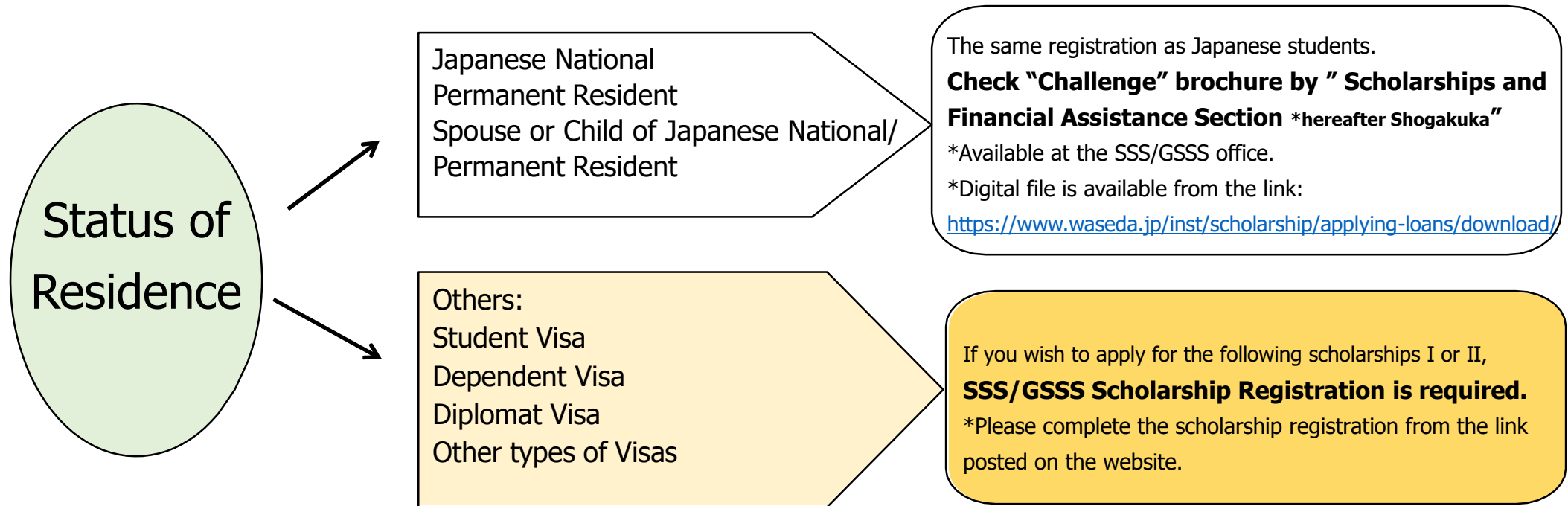


## Scholarship Information for Privately Financed International Students at SSS/GSSS

### I . Scholarship Registration

Registration differs according to your status of residence.



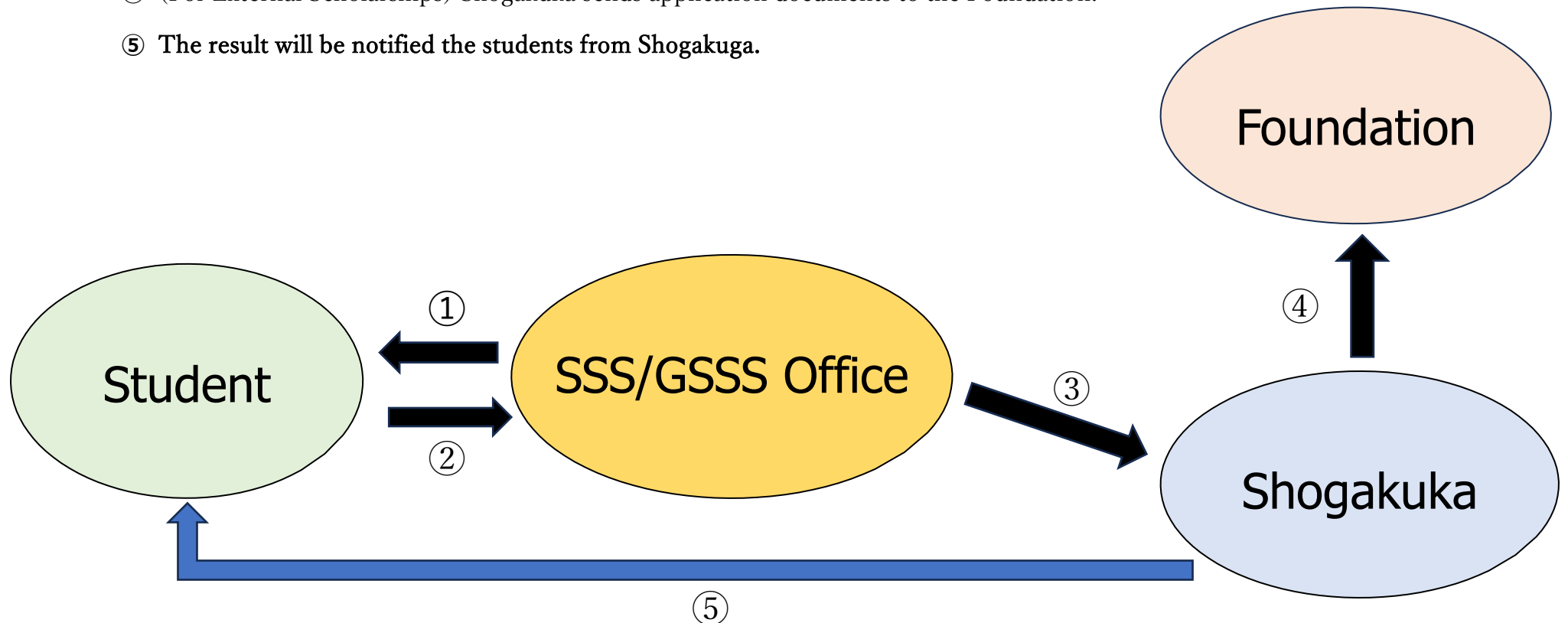
### II . Types of Scholarships for Privately Financed International Students

- I. **Internal Scholarships:** Waseda University's own scholarship. e.g. Tuition-Waiver Scholarship, Azusa Ono Memorial Scholarship  
★Exception: The Okuma Memorial Scholarship does not require any scholarship registration.
- II. **External Scholarships that Require University Recommendation** (Involving Internal Selection)  
★For types of scholarships I and II , selections will be conducted among those who submit the SSS/GSSS Scholarship Registration Form.
- III. **External scholarships / Open Recruitment** (free application):

### III. Scholarship Application Process

#### I and II (Internal Scholarships and External Scholarships that Require University Recommendation)

- ① Candidates will be selected from applicants who have submitted the SSS/GSSS Scholarship Registration Form.  
Detailed notifications will ONLY be sent to the selected candidates.
- ② Selected candidates must submit their application documents to the SSS/GSSS Office.
- ③ After checking the application documents at the SSS/GSSS office, they will be mailed to the Shogakuka.
- ④ (For External Scholarships) Shogakuka sends application documents to the Foundation.
- ⑤ The result will be notified the students from Shogakuga.



### III External scholarships / Open Recruitment (free application)

Please note that most of external scholarships require a high level of Japanese language proficiency.

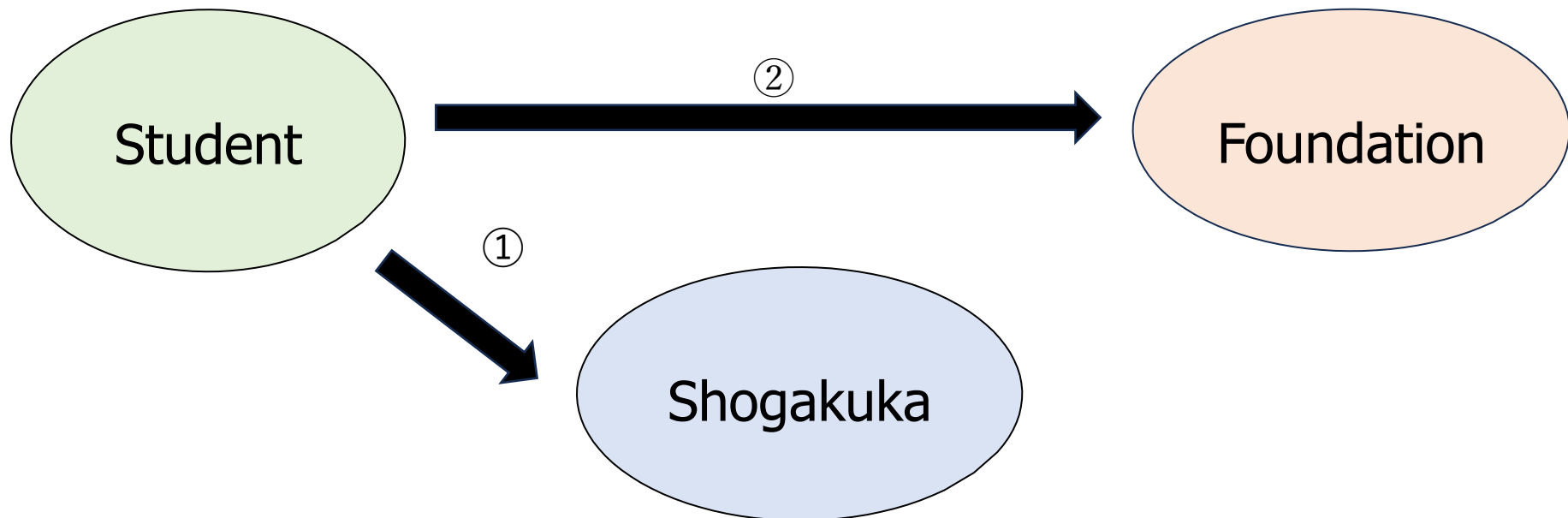


① Check eligibility by referring to the list on Shogakuka website.

### 〈F A Q〉

- Q1. I have submitted my scholarship registration form, when will I receive the results of the selection process?
    - A1. As mentioned in the section”III. Scholarship Application Process”, a detailed notification will be sent to the successful candidates ONLY.
  - Q2. Is it possible to know why I was not selected as a candidate for any of the scholarships?
    - A2. The selection criteria are not disclosed for any reason. Most scholarship selections focus on the student’s financial situation and academic performance.
  - Q3. What scholarships can I apply for now?

Please also note that scholarships offered by external foundations require applicants to have a high level of Japanese proficiency, as most application documents must be completed in Japanese and applicants are often interviewed in Japanese.

Q5. If the application documents require a letter of recommendation (written by an academic advisor), who should I ask to write it?

A5. If a letter of recommendation is required, students enrolling in April should request it from the faculty member in charge of the Learning Community. For second-year students who have already joined a seminar by the fall semester, please request it from your academic advisor. If you are a student enrolling in September and do not have a faculty member who can write the recommendation, please consult the office by two weeks before the submission deadline. For graduate students, the academic advisor will be responsible for writing the letter of recommendation.
