Grade Report Transcript : GSAPS will send the official grade report (transcript) to the partner institution in late September for Spring exchange, in late March for Fall exchange.

Course Requirements : **PhD Students**: As a rule, exchange students are required to register for a Project Research Seminar(Zemi), for which they shall receive grades, but credits won't be given. They may take lecture courses as well.
MA Students: As a rule, exchange students are required to register for a Project Research Seminar(Zemi), for which they shall receive grades, but credits won't be given. Also taking at least one GSAPS course is mandatory.

Student Life in GSAPS

Accommodation : You are requested to arrange accommodation on your own via the webpage of our designated housing agency (<http://waseda-housing.com/fp-9907/>).

Living Expenses : Survey responses from previous exchange students indicate that they spent JPY70,000 to JPY100,000 per month in addition to the rent. Please make sure before your arrival that you can afford all the expense.

Facilities : Upon arrival, each incoming exchange student will receive a student ID card. With the ID card, the student can use the facilities on campus, such as the library, gymnasium, pool, etc.

How to Apply

Application materials should be reviewed by your school office and will be applied to GSAPS with your school's approval.

◆ Eligibility

Please check with your school office regarding the eligibility such as language requirements.

◆ Application Deadline

Spring Semester entrance: **November 15th**
 Fall Semester entrance: **April 15th**
 * Follow the instruction at your institution.

◆ Application Materials

1	Two essays
2	Application Evaluation Form (designated form)
3	Statement of Source of Funds (designated form)
4	English version of the official academic transcripts from your current and previous institutions (Please make sure that it includes the details of your university's grading system; A+=100%, A=80% etc.)
5	A photocopy of language proficiency test scorecard taken within the past two years *Not required for native Japanese or native English speaker *A photocopy of diploma of Bachelor/Master degree from a university in an English speaking country is acceptable
6	Application for Certificate of Eligibility (designated form) (Please refer to the guideline.)
7	A photocopy of your passport (the name, nationality and expiry date must be shown)
8	Three of your physical copies of ID photos (Taken within the past three months)

Upload through online

The GSAPS Office will send you "the Letter of Acceptance" once your enrollment is officially approved.
 The participants will be asked to complete the necessary procedures for the visit.

Before Arrival

* The GSAPS Office will apply for the Certificate of Eligibility which is necessary for you to apply for a student visa at the local embassy/consulate of Japan. You are required to obtain a student visa prior to departure in accordance with the directions by the GSAPS Office.

* The participants need to purchase an overseas travel insurance covering the entire duration of the stay, from departure to return to the country of their home university. Please note that even if you are covered by insurance of your country, you are required to be covered by Japanese health insurance too. They must bear the cost.

FAQ

Q1: Is it possible for exchange students to take courses offered by other graduate schools of Waseda University?

A1: Yes, but please note that not all courses are available. Refere to the designated list on the website.

Please also be aware that you will be a GSAPS exchange student. You must take at least one class at GSAPS, if you are a MA student.

Q2: Do you provide international students with Japanese language classes?

A2: Yes, there are Japanese language courses available. Credits and grades will be given. However, please note that you may not be able to take your preferred courses due to the limited availability and levels of courses.

Q3: Can I get a part-time job?

A3: Yes, you can work part-time under the regulations. Please see the URL below for more details.

Q4: I am a Ph.D. student and would like to choose a supervisor from another graduate school at Waseda for my research.

Is this possible?

A4: No, your supervisor should be one of the professors of GSAPS.

Q5: Can I travel abroad during the semester?

A5: You can travel abroad and re-enter in Japan at your expense as long as you have a student visa and follow the designated procedures. Please inform your supervisor/course instructors/the GSAPS Office of the plan in advance so that we all know your whereabouts. Please be aware that your absence might negatively affect your grades and be insured for any accidents.

Q6: How long can I stay at Waseda as a student?

A6: Student registration will expire on September 15 (Spring Semester exchange)/March 15th (Fall Semester exchange).

You are required to leave Japan in a timely manner despite of the visa expiry date.

Q7: Do I have to purchase an overseas travel insurance?

A7: Yes. All exchange students are required to be covered by insurance during your stay in Japan.

Please note that even if you are covered by insurance of your country,

you are required to be covered by Japanese health insurance too.

You also have to submit a copy of the insurance card to the GSAPS Office on your arrival.

Q8: I don't belong to a GSAPS partner school. Can I apply for the exchange program?

A8: No, only students from GSAPS partner schools can apply for this program.

Q9: I have a Bachelor/Master degree from a university in an English speaking country. Do I have to submit an English proficiency test result?

A9: A photocopy of your diploma is acceptable. If you have any scorecard to submit, however, please submit it.

Q10: Can I enter Japan without a student visa and apply for one after I enter Japan?

A10: No. You must get a student visa prior to your arrival.

Q11: By when should I arrive at Japan?

A11. You are required to be in Japan by the orientation which will be conducted in early April for Spring exchange, in mid-September for Fall exchange.
