| Can I transfer from my current university to Waseda University? | Only the School of Political Science and Economics allows students to transfer to the second year. However, please note that SPSE will discontinue the Admission by Transfer and the last intake will be in 2025. |
| Can I change my school or major after enrolling at Waseda University? | School of Political Science and Economics and School of International Liberal Studies accept transfer students from other Waseda schools/departments. For change of major, only School of Political Science and Economics, School of Fundamental Science and Engineering, and School of Creative Science and Engineering allow within its school. |
| Do I need to go to Japan to take an entrance examination? | For English-based undergraduate degree programs, document screening and online interview (if required) will be conducted. There is no need for the applicants to come to Japan. Regarding Japanese-based undergraduate degree programs, some schools conduct an in-person test or interview. |
| What documents are required to apply for English-based undergraduate program? | Required documents vary depending on the school you apply, please refer to the Application Guides for details. In gengeral, standardized test score, English proficiency test score, transcript, highschool graduation certificate, and statement of purpose are required. Schools where they require an recommendation letter are; School of Political Science and Economics, School of Fundamental Science and Engineering, and School of Creative Science and Engineering. |
| Are there subject requirements on standardized tests? | School of Fundamental/Creative Scienece and Engineering: Math, Physic, and Chemistry are required. School of Political Science and Economics: Math is required School of Social Sciences, School of International Liberal Studies, School of Culture, Media and Society: No subject requirements |
| Is there an expiration date for the standardized test? | There is no expiration date of the standardized test for Waseda University. |
| Is there minimum score requirement on the standardized test? | We do not set a minimum score requirement on the standardized test score. | Is there minimum score requirement on the English proficiency test? | We do not set a minimum score requirement on the English proficiency test, except the School of Culture, Media and Society(JCuIP). For details, please refer to the application guide and confirm the requirements. |

| Is there subject/level requirement on IBDP math? | For IBDP subject level, both HL/SL are accepted. (As a whole, there must be at least 3 HL subjects) For math, both Math AA/MathAI can be submitted. |
| Do you accept my AP score as a standerdized test? | Schools of Fundamental/Creative Science and Engineering accept AP test scores as a standardized test result along with SAT score. Other schools do not accept AP score as a standardized score. |

| How much is the tuition fee for undergraduate programs? | It costs approximately 1.2 - 1.8 Million JPY per year. |
| How much is the average living cost? | It costs approximately 130,000 JPY per month. |
| What type of scholarships are applicable for international students? | There are more than 100 scholarships available for international students. All scholarships funded by Waseda University are partial scholarships and most of them are merit-based. About 30% of international students receive scholarships. |
| Do you have study abroad programs? | We offer various study abroad programs. Most of them are 1 semester or 1 academic year study abroad programs. By transferring credits to Waseda University, you may be able to graduate from Waseda University in 4 years. In general, you pay the tuition fee for Waseda University while studying abroad. |
| Do you have double degree programs? | Yes, we do. Students who complete the double degree program will obtain 2 degrees from Waseda and a partner university upon their graduation from both universities. Application elibigility varies by each program. |
