# Creating an Engaged Classroom with ICT: Good Practices and Organizational Support at Waseda University

# Background

## Macro Level (Policy)

- •FD mandatory under university establishment standards (since 2008)
- •Shifting its conventional teacher-centered method to more learner-centered teaching --- Active Learning (since 2012)

# Meso Level (Basic Information about Waseda University)

- Private university with 40,467 undergraduate students and 8,457 graduate students (by 2019)
- Faculty (tenured 1,685; contract-based 527; part-time 5,462) (by 2019)
- Transitioning to an Interactive Problem Finding and Solving Style of Education
- Center for Higher Education Studies (established in 2014)


## Micro Level

- Research oriented
- Very few faculty members have received pedagogical training or experienced interactive courses

# Good Practice 1: Blended Learning

## **Course Profile**

- For students in the Faculty of Human Sciences
- Around 198–300 students in the class (changes by year)
- Elective course with 2 credits




## Tips

- Video shorter than 15m
- Slides with few words but more images
- Structure group work with clear tasks and clear roles for the group members
- Keep the same group members for more than 2 cycles with equity in mind

## Good Practice 2: Flipped Classroom

## **Course Profile**

- For students in the Faculty of Commerce
- Around 330 students in the class
- Elective course with 4 credits



## **Tips**

- Prompt self study by connecting it with assessment
- Increasing improvement with the quality of quizzes
