

【General information about long-term study abroad programs】

Q. When do students apply for the long-term study abroad programs of CAMPUS Asia?

A. There are 2 recruitment sessions a year, and they will be held around March and September.

Q. Can students from any school participate in the long-term study abroad program of CAMPUS Asia?

A. All students from any school may apply for the program as long as they meet the requirements.

Q. What is/are necessary language(s) for the programs?

A. In principal, the programs are held in English. Only the Double Degree Program at Peking University is held mainly in Chinese, but English is also required. The language requirements for the recruitment session in fall 2017 were as follows, for you information:

Applicants must have a high level of English proficiency equivalent to TOEFL iBT 80 or above (IELTS 6.0 or above also acceptable). (Even if an applicant's score is slightly under the designated one, they may apply for programs since the selection will be a comprehensive evaluation. You can apply with a TOEIC score (730 or above) as well, but please keep in mind that the final decision will be made by host universities.)

In addition to English, a score of 180 or higher of Hanyu Shuiping Kaoshi (HSK, 中國漢語水平考試) level 5 is required for applicants of DDP at Peking University.

(Please note that the TOEFL/IELTS, HSK scores are only valid for 2 years.)

Please confirm the most recent information on the application guide.

Q. Are there any limitations regarding the nationality of applicants?

A. There are some limitations due to regulations at host universities:

Q. Do students in the School of International Liberal Studies (SP1) meet the requirements for graduation as a study abroad by participating in the programs of CAMPUS Asia?

A. Students in the School of International Liberal Studies (SP1) meet the requirements in the following cases:

1. Double Degree Programs

2. Minor-field Programs (Only when students study at 2 countries for consecutive semesters. Students will also be required to acquire 12 or more credits from the CAMPUS Asia designated courses that are held in Waseda, Peking, and Korea University.)

3. Intensive Programs (Only 1 year programs)

(SILS students can not graduate at the end of the semester right after they complete their study abroad.)

Q. Will students receive scholarships?

A. Students will receive scholarship from JASSO (the Japan Student Services Organization) if they meet the requirements.

In addition, round-trip flight tickets will be provided from government expenses. Please note that these are subject to change because financial situations and not guaranteed. For more details, please confirm the most recent information on the application guide.

【Double Degree Program】

Q. What is CAMPUS Asia Double Degree Program?

A. There are 2 Double Degree Programs for CAMPUS Asia students. One is studying abroad in Peking University for 1 year under certain conditions. Students study in both Chinese and English in Peking University and belong to School of International Studies in Peking University. The other is studying abroad in Korea University for 1.5 years under certain conditions. Students study in English in Korea University and belong to College of Political Science and Economics in Korea University and declare one of the following majors: Department of Political Science and International Relations, Department of Economics, Department of Statistics, or Department of Public Administration.

Q. What are “certain conditions”?

A. Students must take 48 credits in Peking University including compulsory courses and elective courses in 1 year. At Korea University, students must take 67 credits including designated courses by the major you declare, in 1.5 years. (The curriculum at each university is subject to change since the open courses vary in each academic year)

Q. What kind of degree is conferred?

A. Bachelor of Laws at Peking University. At Korea University, it depends on which department you declare in. (Bachelor of Arts in Political Science, Bachelor of Arts in Economics, Bachelor of Arts in Statistics, or Bachelor of Arts in Public Administration)

【Courses】

Q. What is “CAMPUS Asia Intensive Program (old name: Joint Intensive Program)”?

A. It is the course offered by Center for International Education during summer and spring vacation. (The course registration period is in spring semester or fall semester) Students must take at least one for CAMPUS Asia program completion. Students may need to participate in a field trip during the course. (Please refer to the syllabus for more detailed contents and course period.)

Q. What is the difference between “CAMPUS Asia Courses” and “CAMPUS Asia Related Courses”?

A. “CAMPUS Asia Courses” are offered by Center for International Education and open to all the departments at Waseda University. “CAMPUS Asia Related Courses” are offered by some departments for those who want to study more and deepen their understanding in this field. The credits of “CAMPUS Asia Related Courses” can be counted for CAMPUS Asia program completion. (Please keep in mind, however, that there are NO special treatments for the course registration and it is possible that students CANNOT register in some of these courses because of rules of the department they belong to)

Q. What kinds of courses are offered at Peking University and Korea University as “CAMPUS Asia Courses”?
