***Summary:***

The University of Canterbury is located in Christchurch, which is the largest city in New Zealand's South Island, in the heart of the province of Canterbury. The city's location on the East coast makes it a perfect environment for recreation – beautiful sandy beaches are close by and skiing and snowboarding can be found at five ski fields within 90 minutes of the city. If you're interested in visiting some of New Zealand's most stunning places, Christchurch is a great base from which to do so and South Island attractions such as alpine resorts, white water rafting, whale watching, surfing, kayaking, and some of New Zealand's most beautiful scenery are easily accessible from Christchurch

Since its establishment in 1873 by scholars from Oxford University, the University of Canterbury has enjoyed an international reputation for academic excellence in both teaching and research. The University's teaching programmes are research based and academic staff are expected to be involved in research and publishing in their areas of specialty. As a result, students can expect to be taught by lecturers who are at the forefront of knowledge in their field. Canterbury offers Waseda students an exciting range of courses in Arts, Education, Health, Business and Science, with the chance to focus on New Zealand and Pacific Studies if they wish. Students may study related topics in fields such as Maori Studies, History, English, Political Science, Art History and Biological Science, along with many more.

***Academic Study***

One semester of English language at CCEL followed by one semester of Study Abroad courses at the University of Canterbury.

Thematic Studies: For the Study Abroad component of the programme (second semester), students may take courses from across the University's wide range of programmes. Many students choose to include at least some courses from New Zealand and Pacific Studies. Examples include courses in Maori language and culture, New Zealand politics, history and biodiversity and New Zealand and Australian literature. Waseda students may also select courses from the University's course offerings in other disciplines according to individual interest.

We also offer a service learning course, CHCH 101 Strengthening Communities through Social Innovation, which is very popular among our Study Abroad students from overseas. ### ***Housing***

1. For CCEL semester – students will stay in a homestay.
2. For the Study Abroad semester (Semester 2, July start), most Study Abroad students choose to stay at the Ilam Student Accommodation or Sonoda Christchurch campus housing near campus, which provides modern self-catered apartments. Students have their own bedroom in a fully furnished flat and share kitchen, living area and bathroom facilities with 4 or 5 other students.

A special accommodation package is available for Study Abroad students for the UC Study Abroad Semester (Semester 2) – see <https://www.canterbury.ac.nz/life/accommodation/international/exchange/> for details. An online housing application is required (deadlines for applications are 1 December for Semester 1 and 1 May for Semester 2). Note that in 2024 the housing application deadline for Semester 2 may be earlier.

All on campus accommodation is located within easy walking distance of the campus, shopping centers, restaurants, and bus transportation to the city center.

### ***Opportunities for Learning Through Experience***

Study Abroad students at the University of Canterbury enjoy access to a wide range of activities. The University is home to a variety of clubs, ranging from tramping and social clubs through to sporting and drama groups. The University's Recreation Centre also offers a variety of programs.

### ***Credits:***

For the Study Abroad component (July semester), a standard semester load at the University of Canterbury is approximately 60 points per semester.

### ***Study Abroad Fees***

**Please note that 2024 fees have not yet been confirmed and will be advised later in the year. All fees and costs listed below are 2023 fees - the 2023 fees are listed as a guide only and are subject to increase for 2024.**

1. Estimated Tuition fee:

a) For CCEL semester: ***Estimated CCEL Tuition Fee (based in 2023 prices)***

Option 1 / \$6,400 (including enrolment fee and material fee)

Option 2 / \$8,700 (including enrolment fee and material fee)

b) For UC Study Abroad semester:

Tuition fee: \$12,400 per semester (in case of an overload of 75 points)

\*Compulsory Student Services Levy: this levy is based on the number of points (credits) students enroll in and in 2023 is \$496.20 per semester if a standard semester load of 60 points is enrolled in. If enrolled in a minimum load of 45 points it is \$372.15 and for an overload of 75 points it is \$620.25. These are 2023 levy amounts and 2024 levy is yet to be confirmed.

2. Room and Board:

1) Homestay (CCEL): NZD 315 per week (2023 fee)

Accommodation Placement Fee: NZD 200 (bus zone) / NZD350 (walking zone)  
(2023 fee)

2) Room at Ilam Apartments in 2023 (UC): NZD 5,324 for one semester plus \$800 deposit. Optional bed linen pack and crockery packs are available to purchase for an additional fee. 2024 fees are yet to be set.

3. Maximum number of students: 10

4. Required student level on departure: Undergraduate Student with at least 2 semesters completed

Other mandatory fee

CCEL insurance fee – Insurance can be arranged through CCEL or by the student. Price will depend on the arrival date and commencing day of Study Abroad insurance.

For Study Abroad semester, \$375 per semester for UC's default insurance, Studentsafe, in 2023. Cost for insurance 2024 is to be confirmed.
