Summary

This program gives WU-UCR students a unique academic-year (9-month) study abroad experience at the University of California, Riverside. WU-UCR students who have met the academic and language requirements may enroll in UC undergraduate credit courses and/or, Extension credit certificate courses (offered mainly in the evenings), all or part of which credits may be transferred to Waseda. The UCR WU-CS-R Academic Advisor will help you choose your classes and guide you through the enrollment process. Enrollment in undergraduate courses is on a space available basis (some impacted classes will not be open; The Academic Advisor will help you select alternative classes that suit your needs).

On-going Academic Support

WU-UCR students will receive appropriate information both in the field of academic and campus life from UCR Extension via pre-departure online orientation, program orientation, and academic and student life advising.

Homestay students can select private or share rooms, meal packages, airport transportation, and weekly transportation to and from UCR or UCR University Extension.

On-Campus Accommodations

International Village (IV)

Located near the UCR University Extension, IV houses international undergraduate and graduate students from across the globe. Accommodation includes furnished and air-conditionedapartments (studio, single and double) with kitchens and living rooms. WU-UCR students will be placed with non-WU students from other nationalities, if requested and if possible.

Opportunities for Learning through Experience

UCR is located on nearly1,200 acres at the base of Box Springs Mountain, within an hour's drive of

famous beaches, mountain and ski resorts, Palm Springs and Los Angeles. Students will enjoy UCR's friendly and warm atmosphere and have many opportunities to meet and socialize with both international and American students. Students may use the state-of-the-art recreation facilities and libraries on UCR campus and participate in campus activities, clubs and organizations. Students will have opportunities to meet and talk with the Program Special Advisor throughout their course of study.

Credits (36 –48 quarter credit hours):

Students are required to complete a minimum of 12 units per quarter in order to maintain F-1 visa status. UCR undergraduate classes and ESL classes are generally held on weekdays. Extension classes are generally offered in the late afternoon evenings and on the weekends. Students wishing to begin their program early may enroll in UCR's Intensive English Program, for an additional fee. Students will be able to access quarterly grade reports and transcripts (UC undergraduate courses and UC Extension courses) within their student portal.
