オックスフォードはロンドンから鉄道で1時間、バスで2時間ほどの距離に位置する世界 的に有名な学術都市です。また、多数の歴史的建造物を有する観光都市でもあり年間を通じて多くの留学生や観光客が訪れます。夏休みのオックスフォード大学は、各カレッジでサマースクールなどが開催されており多くの海外からの学生で賑わいます。イギリスの夏 は日本ほど湿度が高くならないため比較的過ごしやすく、天気の良い日は夜の9時頃まで 空が明るいのが特徴的です。

11世紀創立のオックスフォード大学は、学術的な研究機関として、またチュートリアル 制度、カレッジ制度を特徴としたユニークな教育機関として世界にその名を誇る名門大 学です。研修が行われるハートフォードカレッジ(Hertford College)の設立は1280年代にまで遡ります。中世のたたずまいが美しく、中庭を中心に教会や図書館も併設され ており、 学術の知と歴史を感じさせるカレッジです。早稲田大学とは長期留学プログラ ムも実施しています。


