St Peter's College, one of the 38 colleges of the University of Oxford, welcomes applications for its Visiting Student Programme. This is an exciting opportunity to be part of a vibrant, prestigious yet intimate and friendly community that is committed to academic excellence, both in research and teaching. St Peter's is an inspiring place to be: you will find a diverse group of individuals, united by a shared love of knowledge and respect for creativity.

The tutorial system (unique to the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge) offers you the opportunity to learn in a pair, a group of three, or as an individual, through discussions with tutors who are expert in their field. This will allow you to discuss the issues that interest you most, and that you are most passionate about. The tutorial system ensures that you will be actively participating in lively and enjoyable intellectual debate. As a Registered Visiting Student you will be a full member of the College. You will have the same rights and obligations as other students at the College, and you will have access to most of the University's facilities. These include the libraries (Oxford libraries constitute one of the richest collections in the world), labs, computing facilities etc. As well as tutorials, you will be able to attend lectures, seminars and numerous special events, often involving illustrious external speakers.

Oxford also offers rich and exciting extra-curricular and social opportunities. Both at the College and University levels there are numerous societies and activities that will welcome you, from debating to sport, drama to journalism and more. Whether your interests are mainstream or 'niche', you will be able to develop your existing interests and start something completely new.

Housing and Meal Plan:

Visiting Students are housed along with third year undergraduate St Peter's College students in college-run accommodation in one of our two annexes close to the College, or our new Accommodation block on site. Each student will have a single study bedroom each with an en-suite bathroom. Living amongst British students, sharing meals and conversation, helps Visiting Students to settle quickly into Oxford life and to make friends. Please note, students do not need to apply for accommodation. It will be automatically allocated should they receive an offer.

Self-service breakfast, lunch and dinner are available in College in the Dining Hall every day. There is Formal Hall on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We also have a number of formal 'Guest Nights' when students can invite their friends to Hall. Meals are charged on a "Pay as you go" basis using a contactless payment system.

Facilitation Plan:

Waseda students will be treated as full members of both the College and the University, with access to all facilities on an equal basis with all other undergraduates. They will have full access to university lectures and seminars. St Peter's will make every effort to integrate Waseda students into student life at Oxford.

Credits:

Waseda Students will be provided with an academic report at the end of their studies. This will be sent on to Waseda for credit transfer.

Estimated Tuition: £37,900 – 46,600 * Course Fees for 2024-25. 2025-2026 fees have not been set yet.
