The University of Hawaii (UH) requires F-1 students to carry adequate health insurance. We require that both F-1 students and any F-2 dependents have health insurance for the entire period of their stay in the U.S. HELP offers a health plan that meets UH requirements and costs ~\$205/month.

*Nationality:* Students of any nationality may enroll in the HELP program; the Hoakipa program is not restricted by nationality but by institutional participation in the program.

## Summary:

The University of Hawaii at Mānoa Academic English Program is a flexible course of study designed to meet the needs of Waseda students seeking a truly unique study abroad experience. This program encompasses a semester of study in the University of Hawaii English Language Program (HELP).

The HELP program has been the pathway into degree studies at UH Mānoa for over fifty years for students with TOEFL scores below 61/500. As part of the renowned Department of Second Language Studies, HELP provides Academic English training in vibrant curriculum for students at all levels of proficiency.

Students who achieve 500 on TOEFL before arrival or before October 1 will have the opportunity to pursue credit coursework through the Hoakipa Program in the Spring semester. Such students will take the English Language Institute (ELI) placement test to determine if they have to take any ELI courses in addition to a selection of credit coursework other departments.

Students who meet the requirements for the Hoakipa Program at the time of application in Spring (GPA 2.5 or above, TOEFL 500 or above) will have the opportunity to participate in the Hoakipa Program from the beginning of Fall semester if they so desire.

#### Academic Study

During their semester(s) in the CS-L at UH Mānoa, students will study 20 hours per week at HELP in level-appropriate classes that focus on the language and cultural skills needed for success in an American college environment. They will also engage in service-learning projects that help them become autonomous self-directed learners. In addition to improving their academic English skills, they will grow in self-assessment, critical thinking, ethical reflection, cooperative teamwork, and participation in activities with the larger community both on and off campus.

Note: Depending on the students' level, there may be other Waseda students in their class.

In mid-September, students seeking to study in the Hoakipa program for Spring 2027 will take the TOEFL ITP test offered by HELP. Students who do not reach 500 on the TOEFL at that time may continue to study academic English and college skills through the HELP program in the Spring semester 2027. Students who do reach the necessary TOEFL score of 500/61, on or before the beginning of October will be eligible and can apply through the Mānoa International Exchange (MIX) for the Hoakipa program to continue in credit coursework at UH Mānoa in Spring semester 2027. They will take the ELI placement test before the Spring semester to determine if they have to take any ELI coursework.

#### Housing and Meal Plan

Students will be placed with a homestay family for a complete cultural immersion experience. In academic FALL2026-SPRING2027, homestay will cost \$400 per week. There is also a \$200 placement fee and \$135 roundtrip airport transfer fee. Homestay families are carefully selected and matched to students' interests and preferences as much as possible. Homestay includes a private room with a shared bathroom and two meals—Self serve breakfast and 1-plate dinner.

There is a chance that students will be placed in a homestay that is shared with non-Japanese students. If they are staying in a homestay, they can request to stay with a family that doesn't have other Japanese, but it will depend on the host family availability at the time. *There is no guarantee that Waseda students will have non-Japanese housemates in Homestay*.

Please note: Dorm room availability is not option for 2026-2027. There will be only Homestay option for 2026-2027.

# Opportunities for Learning Through Experience

HELP is the only intermediate level ESL program that offers the chance for students to do Internships for up to 40 hours in the local community. There will be many opportunities for Waseda students to interact with the on- and off-campus community and enrich their learning. Starting in the fall, the Service-Learning projects provided by the HELP program will engage them with worthy organizations and projects that will serve as opportunities for self-reflection and growth. The International Student Association (ISA) at UH Mānoa is very active in providing support and activities for all students who come from abroad, and Waseda students will be guided to join events and activities put on by the ISA. Each Friday there is a cross-cultural exchange International Coffee Hour that students may join. Furthermore, the UH Manoa campus community has clubs catering to a wide variety of interests and pursuits both academic and extra-curricular, and students will bewelcomed into such groups that match their individual interests. And of course, at a flagship university such as UH Mānoa, there are seasonal sporting events happening throughout the year that Waseda students will be able to join as participants and spectators to augment their experience in Hawaii. Finally, Hawaii has limitless opportunities for outdoor activities that take advantage of the natural beauty of our state, both on land and in/on the sea.

## Facilitation Plan and student assistance

During their time in the HELP program, Waseda students will have regular access to staff advisors who will assist them in making the most of their study experience.

## Credits (24-30 semester credit hours):

Students will be studying full time throughout their CS-L at UH Mānoa. Students complete 320 class hours each semester in the HELP program. HELP courses are non-credit but are graded in the normal A-F range with GPA calculated on a 4-point scale. Grade reports will be provided for coursework successfully completed and Waseda is encouraged to grant appropriate English language credits to the students' transcripts.
