Summary

Upon graduation, many graduates of the Japan Study liberal arts colleges enter the nation's best graduate, business, law, and other professional schools.

Founded in 1833, Kalamazoo College is among the 100 oldest colleges and universities in the U.S. Kalamazoo is known for initiating its "K-plan," a liberal arts curriculum that encourages students to take part in experiential learning (learning by doing) through research projects, service learning, internships and study-abroad. Kalamazoo has one of the highest percentages in the nation of students studying abroad.

Academic Study

Liberal arts colleges have competitive entrance requirements and rigorous academic standards. Former Waseda participants have commented on the importance of small class size (about 15 students/course) in helping them improve their English skills. Communication with the professor is an important part of a liberal arts education. Professors know their students by name and encourage students to work together.

Liberal arts colleges take pride in their rich array of courses, offered in a variety of disciplines and at different levels. All students may select courses from the entire curriculum. The college catalog contains a list of the college's courses, but it is important to remember that not all of these classes are offered each semester. Working closely with their academic advisor, Waseda students will select their courses each semester.

Former Waseda students have enjoyed courses in American Studies, Women's Studies, International Studies (including foreign language and literature), and natural science/math/computers. Waseda students who need additional language study will take an ESL course in the fall quarter in addition to other courses of their choice.
