
Waseda CSL students will enroll in Chinese Courses from the Chinese Language Division\* (CLD). While learning Chinese, Waseda CSL students are also required to enroll in at least one NTU academic course per semester.

**\*About CLD**

Established in 1984, CLD offers programs on Mandarin Chinese language training and facilitated research projects in this field. CLD enables students to achieve wide-ranging and fluent competence in spoken Chinese, and helps students develop the reading skills necessary for academic or professional environments.

I. Chinese Course (IS, class size: 5-7 students)	
Course Description	
<p>Waseda students will be placed in the appropriate Chinese Courses given by CLD, according to the results of their entry placement test. Students' level is priority for class arrangement, and students cannot choose their class time. Students are expected to make extensive use of materials in preparation for their classes.</p> <p>There are 3 different time slots per day for different levels. ① 8:20-11:10, ② 12:00-14:50 and ③ 15:10-18:00 from Monday to Friday. Please make sure there's no any time conflicts of CLD &amp; NTU courses.</p>

The students will take 3 classes per day, Monday to Friday for 15 hours per week (Fall, Winter and Spring). Credits are not offered for the courses.

#### **➤ NTU course**

The number of credits awarded in NTU courses is based on the total class hours in a semester: 1 credit is usually equal to 1 hour of lecture each week, 16 weeks per semester.

The following is an example of 2 hours class per semester.
