Aotearoa New Zealand is a modern, English-speaking country with a rich culture, known internationally for its beautiful natural landscapes and the culture of its native Māori People.

Located in the South Pacific Ocean about 2,200km east of Australia, Aotearoa New Zealand has two islands - the North Island and the South Island. Similar in size and shape to the United Kingdom or Japan, New Zealand has a relatively small population of around 5 million people, making it one of the least crowded countries in the world.

Aotearoa New Zealand has four seasons, but extremes of temperature are unusual. Temperatures in Auckland range from an average of 20°C in summer (December to March) to 11°C in winter (June to August).

ELA is located in a modern building on the University of Auckland's City Campus, in the centre of Auckland city. Join our twenty-one weeks General English and Academic English programme, designed especially for Waseda university students. Students will study 11-week of General English course and 10-week of Academic English course at the University of Auckland English Language Academy (ELA). Waseda University students can further practice English speaking skills and experience culture and living in New Zealand in homestay accommodation. Students can take advantage of the beautiful New Zealand Autumn/Winter and explore the city.

Entry Requirements:

IELTS 4.0, TOEFL iBT 30, or an equivalent. English is required for participation in this integrated course.

General English Course

General English will help students to improve their ability to communicate in English in social and work situations. The course focuses on the development of communication skills with a balance of speaking, listening, reding and writing tasks. Students will be integrated according to their English level (Elementary, Pre-Intermediate, Intermediate, Upper Intermediate or Advanced) and will learn through class activities, individual, pair, and group work with other students from a range of backgrounds and nationalities.

General English includes elective classes, which allow students to tailor their course to meet their learning goals, as they can choose a class to focus on a particular subject or skills. Students at Intermediate level and above choose their elective classes upon arrival at the ELA for General English course. Please note that the elective classes are dependent on the level and student demand.

The elective classes include:

- The English for IELTS elective focuses on language development, with competence in the four key IELTS test areas (writing, speaking, listening, and reading) developed during the course. This elective also builds awareness of the IELTS test format and provides practical exam skills and strategies.
- The Business English elective teaches a range of business communication skills, with a focus on practical language. Every few weeks the Business English class will take part in a project involving real-life business skills such as advertising, marketing, presenting, selling a product and writing a report.
- The Communication Skills elective focuses on developing functional listening, speaking and writing skills, covering the themes 'Social and Travel' and 'Work and Study'. There are often projects connected to the themes and language from the course books.
 - > Class type: Integrated
 - > Course length: 11 weeks
 - ➤ Class hours: 20 hours per week (4 hours every day from Monday to Friday except public holidays)
 - > Entry Requirements: Elementary (CEFR level A1, IELTS 3.5 or TOEFL iBT 20)





Academic English Course

This 10-week intensive Academic English course will help students improve students' English language skills to prepare for study success at university. This course provides students with opportunities to develop independent learning strategies and address individual needs in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Students develop the language and academic skills to help them progress to the next level of English, move to one of our pathway programmes, or transition to destination programmes. The participants may be tested to ensure that they are placed at the correct level of study prior to beginning the course in Auckland.

If you wish to improve your IELTS band scores, you may choose:

- Academic English (session 1) + IELTS (session 2)
- Take an IELTS test upon completion of the course at ELA's official IELTS Test Centre.

If you wish to improve your English for future tertiary studies in English Speaking Country, you may choose:

Academic English (session 1) + university preparation skills (session 2)

- Class hours: Total 200 hours (20 hours per week); Plus optional workshops available and selfstudy(2-3 hours every day)
- ➤ Entry Requirements: IELTS 4.0, TOEFL iBT 30, or an equivalent. English is required for participation in this course.



Class timetable

All students receive 20 hours of tuition per week for both General English and Academic English courses, which is made up of two hours of core classes and two hours of elective classes per day (Total 4 hour daily).

Students will be placed in either the Morning Session (8.15 - 10.15 am & 10.30 - 12.30 pm (20 hours)) or Afternoon Session (1 - 3 pm & 3.15 - 5.15 pm (20 hours)) depending on their level of English. Please note some students in the group may have classes in the morning and some students may be in the afternoon, and session placement is subject to change based on study courses and academic block schedules.

Students will receive their General English class timetable on their first day at ELA, and they will receive their Academic English class timetable prior to begins the Academic English course.

Pastoral Care of Students

The University of Auckland English Language Academy has agreed to observe and be bound by the Code of Practice for the Pastoral Care of International Students. Copies of the Code are available from the NZQA website at www.nzqa.govt.nz. A team of pastoral support staff are available to help and provide assistance for all students studying at the ELA.

Learning Support - ELA Study Centre

ELA's Study Centre offers various opportunities for students to improve their English skills. This is the central hub for students to access a range of interactive and engaging activities both inside and outside the school. Students can practice their English conversation with Meet2Chat sessions, led by University of Auckland volunteers twice a week. They can also attend workshops on a variety of topics such as employment skills, academic language skills, spoken communication skills. These are run three times a week by experienced facilitators and are adapted to suit the needs and goals of students.







ELA Extra Curricula Activities

Our students can join a range of free activities including our most popular Meet2Chat! This is a special activity where students can have conversations with English speakers from the University of Auckland. Our students take part in quizzes, short presentations and have many other fun opportunities to practice speaking and listening. ELA students can also book one -on-one tutorials with our teachers and during the tutorials they can get tips and advice on how to develop their English skills.

ELA Social Activities and Special Events

Students can participate in a wide range of activities organised by the Student Services team. The activities are weather dependent and vary by time of year but can include the University of Auckland campus tour, Auckland art gallery, Auckland Memorial War museum, Auckland Domain Wintergarden, Mission Bay, Mt Eden walk, Devonport, One Tree Hill, movies and beach trips. Information is provided to students during the Orientation Programme and on the ELA social activities noticeboard. An additional cost applies to most activities.

ELA Homestay

Homestay accommodation is a great way to learn about Aotearoa New Zealand culture and to practise your English in a friendly and relaxed environment when the students are enrolled in ELA. Families are selected on the basis of providing such support and are experienced in caring for students from many different cultures. In a homestay you live with a family, have your own room, and 2 meals (Breakfast & Dinner) on weekdays and 3 meals on weekends are provided. Most homestays are within 70 minutes from the ELA by public transport (Bus fare \$4 - 7 per way).

The main criteria for homestay placements include:

- > The family is English-speaking.
- > The family is able to provide a well-furnished single room for the student.
- > Dietary requirements of the student are taken into account.

NOTE:

Some of our families host more than one international student, including those from your country who may be from the same group. This allows the students the chance to share their home with another student, while ensuring each student has their own private room.

Living Cost

Generally you should allow approximately NZ\$700 - \$1,000 per week for living costs, including accommodation, food and transport.
