Intensive Program: The Intensive Program (IP) combines high-quality curriculum with experienced instruction to help you achieve your academic, professional, or personal

goals. In the IP, you can focus on academic English, business English, or all-purpose English. Our courses will help you improve your listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills.

University Connection Program: The University Connection (UniConn) program combines academic English preparation with one-on-one advising, admissions workshops, and orientation to US university culture to help you successfully apply and gain admission to undergraduate or graduate degree programs at US universities. Eligible advanced-level students can also apply to take a credit course through Penn's College of Liberal and Professional Studies (LPS). In order to enroll in an LPS course, typically students would need to successfully complete one session at the 800-level and demonstrate their motivation to succeed in a credit-bearing course. It may be possible for Waseda students who are placed in the 800-level for the Spring 2 session to enroll in an LPS course for the Summer 1 session, however, this would need to be discussed with our advising staff.
