This class is a beginner level class for those who have mastered both Hiragana and Katakana. There are two types of lessons: textbook-based lessons and communicative activities.

- In textbook-based lessons, students comprehensively develop the four skills of listening, reading, speaking, and writing. Through practice and tasks, students will increase the number of things they can accomplish using Japanese. Basic vocabulary and grammar will also be studied.
- In communication activities, students will engage in weekly activities conducted in Japanese such as having a conversation and conducting interviews with Japanese speakers.

# (1) 日本語(短期)入門 / Japanese (Short-term) Beginner

Students are also required to prepare for their presentations outside of class time. Grammar homework is sometimes required, and it takes approximately 60 to 120 minutes per session for preparation, review, and homework.

Students talk about their hobbies and interests in groups, and also conduct interview activities with Japanese speakers.</p>

# (2) 日本語(短期)I / Japanese (Short-term) I

This class is a beginner level class for those who have completed their introductory studies. There are two types of lessons: textbook-based lessons and communicative activities.

- In textbook-based lessons, students comprehensively develop the four skills of listening, reading, speaking, and writing. Through practice and tasks, students will increase the number of things they can accomplish using Japanese. Basic vocabulary and grammar will also be studied.
- In communication activities, students will engage in weekly activities conducted in Japanese such as interview with Japanese speakers, presentation of simple survey results.
