4. Contract Period	From April 1, 2027 to March 31, 2028
5. Contract Renewal	Contract renewal shall be determined based on the following factors: (1) The prospect of courses being held in the subsequent school year or semester (dependent on the number of students taking the relevant courses) (2) The lecturer's work performance and attitude (3) The lecturer's competence and aptitude When the contract period ends, the University may renew the contract for a further period that does not exceed one year. The period during which a person works as a part-time lecturer at the University may continue for a maximum of 10 years, including periods serving as a part-time lecturer in other departments and periods covered by an employment contract with the University for a different job category. If courses are taught in every academic year, periods corresponding to semesters during which no courses are taught and periods starting from the day on which a contract is canceled owing to courses not being offered in the relevant semester are not treated as blank periods. The contract period for part-time lecturers who have been continually employed from 31 March 2014 or before will not continue beyond the year in which the relevant part-time lecturer reaches the age of 70.

Salaries	Lecturer Salary: Age 49 and below, ¥38,960 per 100-minute period taught per month (AY 2026 monthly amount) Age 50 and above, ¥41,640 per 100-minute period taught per month (AY 2026 monthly amount) Note: 1) Salaries are based on a lecturer's age as of 1 April. 2) If revisions are made to lecturer salaries, the amounts indicated above may change. 3) Salaries are paid out on the 15th of each month. However, if a payment date falls on a bank holiday, the salary is paid on the previous business day. Commutation Allowance: A commutation allowance is provided, based on the actual fare covering the distance and route recognized by the University as being reasonable. [Salary example (monthly amount for lecturer aged 50 or above and teaching two 100-minute periods per week during the Spring Semester and Fall Semester): Lecturer salary ¥41,640 x two periods = ¥83,280 per month (AY 2026 monthly amount)]
