Incoming exchange students can apply to live in a university residence hall, though accommodation is limited.

Students requesting Georgetown accommodation may be placed in a university residence hall in the East End neighborhood of Washington DC, approximately 6 km east of Georgetown's Hilltop campus.

Housing cost will be approximately \$7,500 per semester (for the 2025-26 school year).

Students living off-campus are responsible for finding their own housing.

A student who lives in university accommodation can expect the following expenses:

On-campus housing (for 2025-26): approx.. \$7,500 per semester

Meal plans (for 2025-26): \$3576 per semester

Books: approximately \$150 - \$250 per class

Personal expenses: varies greatly depending on personal taste and transportation needs.

We recommend that undergraduate students take 4 courses their first semester at Georgetown rather than five. This gives them the opportunity to get used to the "American" system. In addition, they will have some time to experience other on-campus activities and activities in Washington, DC.

Q13. Mandatory fees Waseda students must pay to your institution

Waseda students will pay for their room, meal plan, books and internet fee. The GLFP students will receive the same benefits as the exchange student to Georgetown, Georgetown tuition, and Yates gymnasium fee.

Yes, but Georgetown will pay for the health insurance plans. The cost is approximately \$4,350 per year.
