### Profile of Speaker:

Dr. Mario Giampietro is a research professor of Institute of Environmental Science and Technology of Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona and has a Ph.D. in Social Sciences from Wageningen University in Netherlands. He has worked on integrated assessment of sustainability issues for many years and is well-known as a developer of Multi-Scale Integrated Analysis of Societal and Ecosystem Metabolism, which links between the metabolism of socio-economic systems and the potential constraints of the embedding natural environment. He has more than 150 scientific publications in the prestige journals such as Ecological Economics, Energy, and Nature and is also the author of several books. He is one of the leading environmental scientists in European region.

The nearby subway station is Waseda Station (T04) on the Tokyo Metro Tozai Line (Blue T line ). At the station, please take Exit 3a. Once you get to the ground level, please walk to the left and turn left at the first corner. If you walk for about a block, you will see South Gate of Waseda University. Instead of entering the Waseda Campus through the South Gate, please walk to the right until you see another gate of the university, the Main Gate.
