昭和11（1936）年、東京都生まれ。33年に東京大学法学部、35年に同経済学部卒業、40年にイエール大学経済学博士。56年に東京大学経済学部教授となり、61年にイエール大学教授に転出する。国際金融の分析で世界的に評価が高く、平成13年から内閣府経済社会総合研究所所長をつとめた。著書に『金融』（館龍一郎氏と共著）、『国際金融の政治経済学』など。また、若田部昌澄氏と勝間和代氏との共著で『伝説の教授に学べ！ 本当の経済学がわかる本』を上梓。

Biographical Note

Koichi Hamada is the Tuntex Professor of Economics at Yale University, where he specializes in the Japanese economy and international economics, and Professor Emeritus at the University of Tokyo, where he taught before coming to Yale in 1986. In his book, was published as *The Political Economy of International Monetary Interdependence* (MIT Press, 1985), which was one of the first studies that applied game theory to the subject of international policy coordination. He introduced the methodology of “Law and Economics” to Japan’s legal system in the 1970s. In 1997, he served as the external evaluation team of the Enhanced Structural Adjustment Facility (ESAF) Program of the IMF, and later joined advisory groups to Mike Moore and Supachai Panitchpakdi, two Director Generals of the WTO.

From 2001 to 2003, Hamada served as President of the Economic and Social Research Institute (ESRI), Cabinet Office of the Japanese Government. He advocates more active monetary policy to resolve deflation and the excessive appreciation of the yen in a book coauthored with Masuzumi Wakatabe and Kazuyo Katsuma.

In November 2006, Koichi Hamada was awarded an order of sacred treasures, gold and silver, by the Japanese Government.
