“Implicit learning, implicit transfer and vicarious experience of sequential performance”



Behavioral sequences such as typing at a keyboard and playing the piano have an important role in daily life. How can we execute these behavioral sequences smoothly? Previous works in cognitive science field have shown that people are able to implicitly learn a hidden rule of a given sequence through experiences of simple actions. That is, unbeknownst to people, they can learn the rule even if they did not have an intention to learn it, which

may be an underpinning to explain the reason why people can perform sequential behaviors smoothly. In the present talk, I would like to give a brief overview as to how implicit learning of sequential behaviors has been investigated, and my past and current studies regarding implicit transfer and vicarious experience of sequential performance, respectively.

「系列行為における潜在的学習，潜在的転移と追体験」

キーボードのタイピングやピアノ演奏はヒトの連続的な動作を必要とします。また我々の何気ない日常生活においても連続的な動作が必要とされる場面も多くあります。では我々はどのようにしてこれらの動作を円滑に遂行しているのでしょうか？認知科学分野の先行研究によると、ヒトはボタン押しなどの系列行為を通じて、その背後にある規則性を潜在的に学習できることが示されています。これは、「規則を学ぼう」という意思がなくとも、気づかいうちに学習できてしまうことを示唆しており、潜在的に学習しているからこそ、我々は動作を円滑に遂行できると言えます。

す。本発表では、潜在的学習はどのように研究されてきたのかを簡単に概観し、私が明らかにした潜在的転移および現在取り組んでいる追体験の研究についてお話ししたいと思います。
