Speaker Profile

Dominic Lieven is an Honorary Senior Fellow of Trinity College, University of Cambridge and a member of the British Academy of Sciences. Specialising in Russian imperial history and empire/czarism, he was awarded the Wolfson History Prize in 2010 for his book *Russia Against Napoleon: The Battle for Europe, 1807 to 1814* (2009) and *Towards the Flame: Empire, War and the End of Tsarist Russia* (2015), which won the Pushkin House Prize in 2016. Other books include *The Rise and Fall of Empires* (1 & 2) (translated by Hidekazu Matsui, Nihon Keizai Shinsha, 2002), *In the Shadow of the Gods: The Emperor in World History* (2022), and numerous other imperial histories, mainly of Russia.
