

LIBRARY QUICK GUIDE

Waseda University Library is one of the most extensive university libraries in Japan, holds around 6 million books, 55,000 journals, and available around 1 million electronic resources.

Waseda University Library consists of over 20 libraries including Central Library, Campus Libraries, School Libraries, and Student Reading Rooms.

The library materials are a valuable asset of the university. Each user is responsible to treat them with care and make good use of them.

WINE is the Waseda University Library's main search interface for library collections and academic resources.

It includes:

- Waseda University Library's catalog (bibliographies and library holdings).
- E-journals, E-books, and databases subscribed by Waseda University.
- Articles and book chapters (by searching within subscribed databases).
- · Keio University Library's catalog (consortia member library).

Search Scope / Tweak your results

When searching, you can select the scope of your search from the drop-down list on the right of the search box, such as "Library Catalog and E-Resources" or "Articles", etc.

After searching, you can narrow down your search results with "Tweak your results" such as languages or material types.

♦Sign in / My Library

If you belong to Waseda University, please sign in to WINE. You can:

- browse ALL results including restricted contents.
- save your search results ("My Favorites").
- view and renew the due dates of the materials you borrowed ("My Library").
- place holds on items borrowed by other users or request items of some libraries.
- Waseda full-time faculty & staff, emeritus professors, and graduate students are eligible to submit a request to pick up Keio University's holding materials (personal borrowing request) at the Waseda University Library.

This portal website provides an easy way to access online databases, e-journals and e-books to which Waseda University subscribes, as well as open-access e-resources.

Databases include newspaper databases (Asahi, Yomiuri, Mainichi, Nikkei, the world's major papers), article databases (Web of Science, Scopus, CiNii Research), dictionaries, etc.

E-Journals include *Nature*, *Science* and other essential academic and professional journals published in Japan and overseas countries.

E-Books include academic, general and reference books written mainly in English or Japanese. (Ebook Central, Springer Nature Link, Maruzen eBook Library, KinoDen, etc.)

HOW TO USE THE LIBRARIES & READING ROOMS

Using the Library

A Student/Faculty ID card, or Library card is required to enter libraries, borrow materials and use other library services.

Borrowing and Returning

To borrow books or other materials, a Student/Faculty ID card, or Library card is required.

Return Anywhere Service

With the "Return Anywhere Service", the items borrowed from Central Library, campus libraries and student reading rooms can be returned at any of these libraries.

Lost or Damaged Books

Users are required to pay for compensations following the library rules if items are lost or damaged.

COMPUTERS IN THE LIBRARIES

There are areas with PCs connected to the internet, as well as libraries and reading rooms where users can bring their own laptops and connect to Wi-Fi. For details, please visit the library's website and the Waseda IT Service Portal.



PHOTOCOPY

Under the Act of Copyright Law, users can photocopy library materials. Please use a pre-paid copy card which is common to all libraries on campus. 1,000 yen and 2,000 yen cards are available. Some libraries have coin-operated or e-money machines.

There are designated areas where you can discuss with others. Please ask at each library's desk for more details.

Material Types


Books, journals, newspapers, doctoral dissertations, master's theses, etc.
