### Waseda University Partial Tuition Waiver for Privately Financed International Students

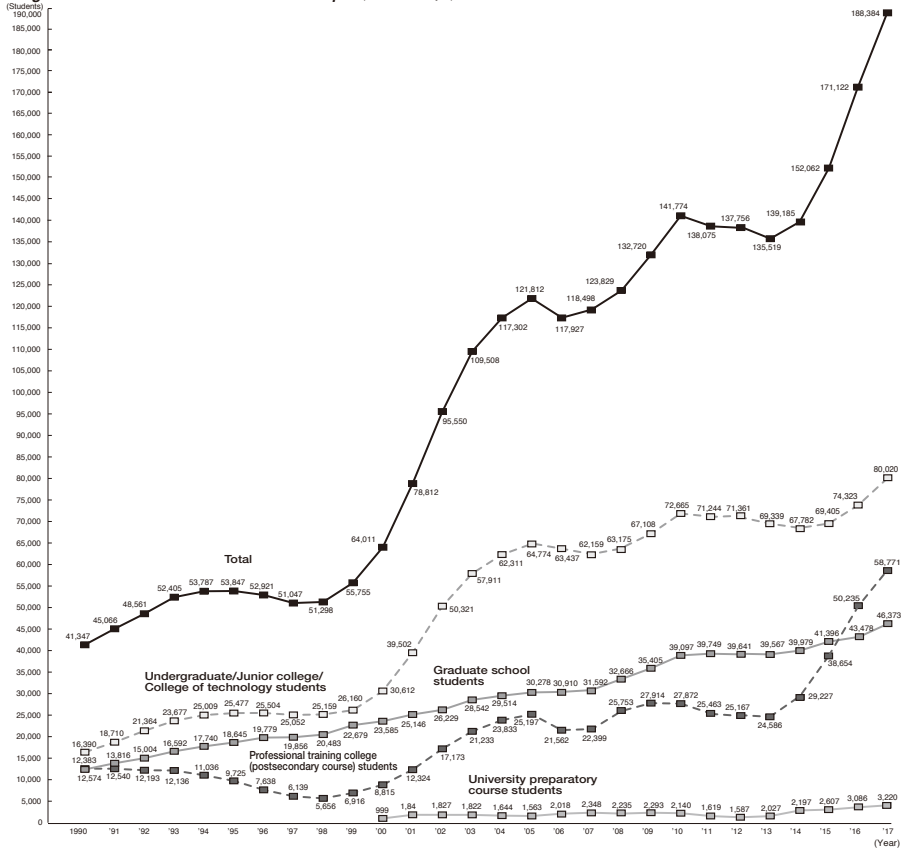
